SOME NOTES FOR AGRICULTURISTS

Raising the Sunflower for its Seed.

Germanium Telegraph.

For a year or two the subject of feeding the seed of sunflowers to fowls has been referred to in poultry journals frequently with approval, and we have seen no word in opposition.

Although this flower, it can be so called, has come into favor even among ladies and some pantaloons creatures who are said to be of the male gender, it is by no means an attractive floral attribute.

It is something among flowers that the elephant is among beasts, huge and uncouth. Still, if it possesses the merit of producing wholesome food for the feathered tribe, it is to that extent so much beyond flowers in solid value.

But it being proved that it is a plant of more or less value to its seed, and being very hardy in its nature, it substitutes, usefulness for beauty; and as it will grow in every out-of-the-way corner and place, where scarcely anything else can be cultivated, it can be honestly recommended to the keeper of fowls to appropriate such plots of ground to the raising of it for its seed.

It would not require much space to produce from three to five bushels of seed, which would be a substantial addition to the winter season's supply of chicken food.

There is no more popular flower than the violet, and as it is one that can be enjoyed by all with very little labor, while the expense is not to be thought of, we are often surprised of its absence in many house-holds.

It is one of the earliest to bloom; in fact, it can be enjoyed almost throughout the entire year; and is so hardy that it requires very little protection. At most a cold frame, covered in winter with straw matting, which a bundle of straw will supply, will be sufficient to give us flowers in the latter part of March, when the plants, which have been increasing, should be partly removed and set in the open ground.

A portion of these may be left remain out all winter, well covered with manure, to be uncovered early in March. It is also one of the prettiest and most welcome house flowers, being planted in a suitable wooden box and placed in a cool part of a room, and aired occasionally by being set in the sun at a window in the room, in which there is no fire, and allow the sash to be raised for an hour at mid-day when the weather is not too severe.

There was very little intermission the past fall, winter and this spring so far, in which we could not gather a little bunch of violets; and we should consider it a real deprivation to be without them.

The Culture of Okra.

There is probably not one in ten gardens where okra is to be found, and we feel like calling attention again to it. The seed is to be had at all our seed stores, and frequently at country stores where the proprietor keeps on hand a supply of garden seeds.

We have raised a crop regularly for over twenty years, and it would be hard for us to abandon it. The seed should be drilled three or four feet apart, and when the plants get a few inches high they should be thinned out, leaving the strongest growers stand, to about ten or twelve inches apart in the row. Keep the weeds and grass down, the same as for corn, and that is all there is about it. The stalks begin to throw out pods when they are eighteen or twenty inches high, and there are the things wanted. When the pods have just escaped from the blossom, or when they are an inch or so long, they can be plucked and used as a side dish, or compared to them for soups, or they can be stewed and used as a side dish.

When there are more than for present use, they can be string up and hung away in a dry, cool place, winter, and can be used for soups in the summer, the difference being scarcely distinguished. This is very little trouble, and they are always at hand. Of course they must be plucked, whether for immediate use or for winter, when they are from one to two inches long, and the outer skin can be easily cut with the finger-nail.

Buy the seed of the tall okra, and by replanting it a year or two it will become dwarf enough, though the short stalks produce about as many edible pods as the taller ones.
