Wolfe's Weakness.

The Republicans of Pennsylvania have their ticket given to them to-day at Harrisburg, and, thanks to the convenient practice which surrenders the naming of it to the man who holds the United States patronage in his hand, we know in advance what it is to be. We are told that since Senator Cameron has met the delegates at Harrisburg he has surrendered a part of his purpose and consents that Mr. Wolfe shall not go on the ticket; because he finds that his followers will have none of him. Cameron thought it politic to nominate Wolfe, and no doubt it would have been. It was so manifestly to his advantage and to Wolfe's disadvantage that it has seemed quite incredible that he could have induced the latter to walk into the trap. Concurrent reports, however, are all to the effect that Wolfe was willing to take the lieutenant governorship, and was even anxious for the place. If so, he is a much smaller man than he has been esteemed. He occupied a strong position in an independent movement which he loses and becomes as nothing by going into the Cameron camp. He would have surrendered his leadership for the honorable but comparatively inconspicuous and unimportant lieutenant governorship. Surely he would have sold out cheap; but now that he does not gain the bauble that he reached for, he takes nothing by his desertion of the independent cause. He sits down between two stools. His old followers refuse to follow him and his new friends decline to receive him. If it be really true, as all accounts say, that Wolfe has been thus coquetting with Cameron, he cannot again command the confidence of the Independents. They have no use for men of his mould. His whole stock in trade has been the public admiration for his intrepidity and boldness, and the faith in his honesty and inflexible adherence to his convictions. A man who starts out with a denunciation of machine politics and makes that the foundation of his opposition to regular Republican nominations, and who in one year afterwards is seen seeking such nomination at the hands of the machine leaders, certainly ceases at once to pose as an apostle of reform and the arch-enemy of political rings.

No wonder that Senator Cameron was anxious to buy Wolfe with an innocent office. It would have been so clear a demonstration to the people of the hollowness of the professions in favor of pure and democratic politics on the part of the Independent Republicans who have been shrieking so wildly and so long against the Cameron machine. He would have shown that they shrieked only because they were out and wanted to get in. "Here," Cameron says; "see this man Wolfe, the very boldest and loudest and most uncompromising of the howlers against the machine; - the man whose pure political soul so revolted against the rule that he raised his banner of reform a year ago against the regular Republican candidate, against whom he made no objection but that I had named him. See this patriot now accepting a nomination to office at my hands and deserting his friends to be my follower. See the material of which you Independents and you Reformers are made. As I have bought this, the chief of them, so can I buy anyone else in the crowd."

Doubtless in so saying he would do injustice to many reform Republicans who are honest, sincere and unpurchasable; but who can tell surely who such men are when this man Wolfe, so fully trusted, has so easily been seduced? The tendency of Wolfe's desertion will be to make the people suspicious of the prophets of reform, to cause them to distrust their professions, and generally to disgust them with the cause. In this view it was wise in Cameron to want Wolfe on the ticket and stupid in his followers to object to the dose; especially when they could so easily have slain him by falling to vote for him, after nominating him; as most likely was the purpose of Cameron in putting him on the ticket.

It is hard to believe that Wolfe has been so silly as to get himself into the position assigned him by public report; and difficult to see how he is going to restore his ruffled feathers as a reform leader after having had his coat cut so sadly in the Cameron camp. It looks as though he would have to go out of political business altogether; and this much of value has come to Cameron in his dicker, that he has disarmed a most pestilent fellow.

The Logic of the Law.

Mr. Reed argued before the supreme court that Guitau could not be held for the murder of Garfield because his victim had not died in the county in which he was wounded, and so was not under the common law indictable in either, because no complete act of felony was done in either jurisdiction. Congress has passed no law to amend this defect in the common law. Mr. Reed cited many and eminent authorities from Coke and Blackstone down to maintain his declaration that the common law was as he stated it. The chief justice seemed quite incredulous notwithstanding, insisting that the act of felony was complete when the prisoner had given the mortal blow. That would be the sensible conclusion, no doubt; but, as Mr. Reed sharply suggested, the law was not always sensible and the judges were bound to take it as it was, not as it should be. The truth is that the law concerning murder is a very senseless one; it does not punish the man for his act but for its consequences. The man who shoots another with intent to kill him but does not, is just as guilty as the one who does intend, victim dies. The death does not really add to the guilt of the offense and should not add to its punishment. Yet in the one case the man escapes with a fine perhaps, while the other man is hung.

The chief justice asked Mr. Reed what part of the offense remained to be completed after the man had got through with doing all that he could to kill

another - he doing to him that which inevitably would kill him? Whether there is anything in the fever, or in the short breath, or in the last strangulation, that enters into the aggression on his life? Obviously the criminal had done all he could do to complete his offense. Yet it was not murder until Garfield died. So the offense was not completed until then; and Mr. Reed seemed to have all the weight of authority on his side in maintaining that the criminal could not be indicted under the common law. Senseless as such a conclusion seems, it is a logical consequence of the fact that a man cannot be punished for murder until his victim dies.

CAMERON'S SLATE.

WOLFE CROUCHED OVER THE TICKET.

BEAVER, HAWLE, RAWLE, GREER and Butler the Candidates - A Stampedue Against Wolfe Which Cameron Could not Check. McClure's Harrisburg Special.

Senator Cameron arrived here last night, took command in person, called a council of war, and at noon to-day the following ticket had been definitely decided upon: Beaver for governor, Wolfe for lieutenant governor, Hawle for supreme judge, Greer for secretary of internal affairs and Davies for congressman-at-large. The decision of Cameron and his associate leaders was declared to be final, and prompt measures were taken to enforce submission. Davies had been compelled to consent to his transfer from the second place on the ticket to the tail end, in order to give a position to Wolfe, who Cameron regarded as necessary to play Wolff's hand, he is worth. He believed that Wolfe would be strong with the Independents for an office that would make him a member of the board of pardons, and for that reason he forced Davies to a reluctant assent to a very important reconsideration of large.
