CALAMITIES ON LAND AND SEA.

Fires in the Bush and Dangers on the Deep Large bush fires are again reported in various portions of Ontaria. There is much alarm among the farmers near Hull, their buildings being threatened. The wrecked steamer Pliny, ashore on

Deal Beach, is fast breaking up, and the beach is strewn with her debris. It is doubtful if even her engine can be saved. New Orleans, put in yesterday at Halifax They have been tried and found wanting, tor coal, and reported that she had been unable to get into Sydney, Cape Breton, because of ice.

The loss by the fire at Leadville, Colorado, last Friday morning, is now esti-mated at \$300,000. The body found in the river is believed to be that of Arthur Ballow, and the number of missing is reduced to three.

Since the 25th of April 47 cases of smallpox have been officially reported in Trenton, New Jersey. Of this number 28 are under treatment in their homes, 12 are in the hospital and 7 have died. All but two of the sick are said to be recovering.

Crushed by the Icc. The schooner President, from Antwerp arrived at Quebec on Saturday night, with six of the crew of the ship Western Belle, lost in the ice on May I. The Western Belle ran into an iceberg luring the night, had her bows crushed in, and sank in twenty minutes. The captain and thirteen of the crew perished by the swamping of one of the boats as the ship went down. The mate and six others escaped in the remaining boat, and were picked up next day nearly frozen to death. Notes of Trade and Labor.

Samuel May & Co., iron merchants of Boston, suspended on Friday and have called a meeting of their creditors for the 27th inst. Their liabilities are estimated at several hundred thousand dollars; their assets are enough to cover their debts.

The strike among the miners in the Indiana coal region is against a reduction of the price of mining from \$1 to \$90 cents per ton, and a reduction of 5 per cent. on the day's work. The miners now make \$1.45 per day.

A telegram from Pottsville says that 7,000 acres of coal lands on the Broad mountain, estimated to contain 100,000,000 tons of coal, have been leased for 25 years to prominent capitalists of New York and Mauch Chunk. Six large collieries will be built and mining operations begun at

The Cleveland bridge and car works of Cleveland, Ohio, of which H. M. Claffin is president, made an assignment on Saturday for its creditors. The wages of the workmen are three months overdue. It is said the works " have on hand large contracts which will be profitable, but which have already required such a large expenditure that payments could not be met as they fell due;" and that the suspension will be only temporary.
