Accidents are all the time happening to passe goods, by which their prices go down; and we think ourselves fortunate, whenever accidents happen so as to bring useful, though unfashionable, goods to you, through us, at prices which some of you are eager to pay.

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Such chances we properly call bargains. But they are bargains only for people of narrow means; or for the great number of wise people who prefer to be always a little behind the quick fashion; or for homely uses.

But now the most fashionable colored dress-goods we have are fallen; not a few, but many; not one or two sorts, but substantially eighty sorts—for we may count colors as sorts from your point of view.

And they have fallen a quarter, a third, and even a half. \$4 to \$8.50 now buys such a dress as a few days ago was sold for \$8 to \$12.50; the saving on the dress being just about \$4.

The goods are French melanges, silk-and-wool, and all-wool checks and check-stripes. We are the more explicit in making this extraordinary statement; because advertisers are interested witnesses, and ought to be cross-examined sharply.

Either we tell the clear truth, or an unmistakable lie. And this is written for the eyes of those who have some doubt about our general habit in this regard.

Black dress-goods afford bargains too; not so many, nor so various, nor so extraordinary, but such as ordinarily would justify very strong language.

The best catch among these bargains are Lupin's laines and zerrina, nun's veiling, lace-bunting and armure-and-open-stripes.

Silk bargains.—Later news would doubtless make this paragraph truer, or fuller, at least. American black silk at 80 cents; black satin at \$1; black surah at \$1; rhadame at \$1 and \$1.25; Parisian novelties in general.

Laces.—We should much like to set the most acceptable of them before you. It is a difficult thing to do. In general terms, we have an abounding stock of everything within our scope.

Many things we have habitually enough below the market to call bargains, but for the fact that they are always here, and so get to be an old story; such as Spanish laces, coarse antique ties, hemstitch collars, etc.

Ficelle is a tan hand-made linen lace which is having so great success in Paris that our buyer there has sent us more than we should buy, without first knowing whether it is going to succeed here.

The fixed-hoop-pannier skirt, which takes care of itself is so great a good to ladies, and so sure to win general favor, that we return to it again and again.

It costs \$1.75 to \$3, and is, on the whole, better than hair cloth does not act exactly as hair cloth does. In one respect hair cloth is better. In most respects this is better.

Let every lady see it. It is a good thing for us that we control it for Philadelphia. It would be a bad thing for you, if we put a large price on it, because we could do so. We don't.
