The consequence is that the great majority of these small farmers in the new states and territories in the West have more land than they can cultivate by their own labor, and can very well afford to give good wages and ateady employment to foreign emigants, by whose help they can easily raise profitable crops and abundant livestock, from the sale of which they would have drain of the native population by the domestic emigration to the West and South, this influence is gradually but surely causing a great change in the character of the population of a large surplus left in cash after paying all expenses. In consequence of this condition of things, the foreign laborers arriving in New York in search of employment are sent off by railroad to the interior without delay, and thus there is no accumulation in New York. They generally report that times are very bad in Europe with the working classes of the population. It is somewhat singular that the old states of New England draw very heavily upon New York for supplies very heavily upon New York for supplies of all kinds of labor, both in agriculture and manufactures. By this process, taken in connection with the long continued and steady improvement in those states, it is highly probable that this influence may revive the droop-ing fortunes of New England agriculture, and make plentiful crops to grow on what have long been neglected wildernesses and waste-places. There is an abundance of room also in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland for an improvement of the same sort, and we are glad to believe that the opportunity has not been overlooked. In South Jersey alone there are still immense wildernesses wholly uncultivated, notwithstanding all the efforts of railway companies, capitalists and realestate operators to plant settlements in the forest tracts, where crops might be raised for the markets of Philadelphia and New York. There is room there for a million people to earn a comfortable living and that will inevitably be found there before the close of the present century. Agriculture is the chief reliance of every country, and especially has it proved of great value to ours.
