AMERICAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION. Its Annual Convention in St. Paul—Dr. Atles for President. The twenty third session of the American medical association began is St. Paul,

Minn., with an attendance of over seven hundred delegates and permanent members from all the states of the Union. Protests from most of the societies against the admission of the delegates of the New York state society, on account of their action in regard to consulation of

regular practitioners with homocopaths were received by members with loud applause. They were referred to the judicial council for action. Letters of regret from Dr. S. D. Gross of Philadelphia, and Dr. J. J. Woodward,

U. S. A., of Washington, were read. Dr. P. O. Hooper, of Little Rock, Ark. acting president, read the annual address, in which he dwelt upon the importance of preventing the introduction into communities of contagious diseases, and stated it as his epinion that vaccination should be compulsory in all the states of the Union. He pand a tribum to the president of last year, Dr. J. T. Hadgen, who died recently at St Louis, and to the president, Dr. J. J. Woodward, who is in Europe to regain

his health. It was decided to send a message of greeting to Dr. Woodward by cable. The Minuesota state society, in session at St. Paul, were invited to attend the sessions as members by invitation.

A communication from the Woman's National Christian Temperance Union was then read by Dr. N. S. Da is, of Chicago, in which they advocated introducing the study of physiology, anatomy, hygiene, and especially the results of the use of in toxicating liquors upon the human body as a part of hygiene, in schools supported by public money. This was referred to the section on state medicine.

The morning session then adjourned and the delegates of the different states met separately to elect their member in the nominating committee. The Pennsylvania delegation chose Dr. Fricke, of Philadelphia, as their representative, and instructed him to give his vote for the nomination of Dr. Atlee, of Lancaster, for the presidency.

In the afternoon the different sections met at halls assigned for the purpose of reading and discussing papers. Dr. Carl Seiler read a paper on the use of electricity in surgery and showed a novel instrument for the removal of bony tumors. He was also elected secretaay of the section of laryegology. Dr. J. G. Lee, of Philade!phia, read a paper on suicide and Dr. Shocmaker a paper on chlorate of pot-
