THE TOBACCO MARKET.

TRADE IN SEED LEAF AND HAVANA For the Week Ending Saturday, June 10

U. S. Tobacco Journal. We are happy to note a decided improvement in the market. The inquiry for old and new goods was quite encouraging, and sales of old at least were more numerous than for a long time past. Our remarks of last week, that the stock of leaf in manufacturers' hands is very small, and that even a slight increase in orders would force them into the market, are being borne out fast. Several of our large man ufacturers invested in '80 Pennsylvania this week on meeting with offerings reasonable in price, while several others are at present in treaty with certain holders of such stock. The inquiry for fine '80 New York state and Wisconsin Havana seed was also quite satisfactory, and resulted in sales of over 400 cases. Ohio, too, sold with a will, and only Connecticut did not share in the improvement, it selling in very small quantities, though by no means

at reduced figures. Those examining '81 tobacco by packers' samples find a a great deal of comfort in the quality and yielding capacity of the stock, but much discomfort in the figures that are asked for it. The comparatively few holders of really choice '81 Pennsylva nia consider any suggestion of an offer at much less than 30 cents a decided piece of impudence. With the apparent enormous yield of the fine wrappers and the

guarantee of but about 15 per cent.of fillers in 100-case lots, the prices asked don't seem exhorbitant, but the Wisconsin and a portion of the New York state crops show a mass of wrappers; and not alone can these two growths be bought at lower figures, but they also show a silkiness in texture and a maturity of color which may be termed absolutely perfect. Under these circumstances the supremacy of fine '81 Pennsylvania in the market seems as yet problematic. Holders of it assert that the fact of the present maturity of color in the Wisconsin and New York state is a sign of approaching daugerous tendencies of the leaf. Holders of these topaccos smile at the assertion and claim that the alleged fine Pennsylvania is "wooden" in texture and color, which is a sure sign of approaching h. dening, preventing the leaf from sweeting successfully. The allegations of both sides certainly have some foundation, but this much is a dead certainty-that whoever can exhibit a perfect packing of leaf, be it Pennsylvania, Wisconsin or New York state, may be sure of a profitable sale in the not distant

The '81 Connecticut is, as far as can be judged now, not quite so satisfactory as last year's crop. Nevertheless, it will sell. The prices paid have not increased. The crop is not much large, than in former years, and the people that cling to Connecticut don't seem to die out. Slow and slim as its sale has been for many years past, it has always found its way out of SPRING and SUMMER SUITING. the market with more or less profit to its patrons.

Leat. Seed Leaf-A week of summer entered into and the effect felt, and yet so far as packers and dealers are concerned they report very favorable business for while it may be considered dull, still the daily trade of each house far execeds their expectations. As a result, old leaf is moving off rapidly at full valuation; so much so, that holders of new stock of all grades begin to feel hopeful and encouraged, because there is now strong probabilities of a demand in the fall for new leaf at a decided margin. New Pennsylvania and Wisconsin is looming up nicely; it is be-youd doubt better goods than anticipated, and must yield a fair return.

There has been scarcely a ripple in the local market for a week past. A few small lots of old leaf have been sold on private terms, and a few crops of new have been picked up by packers. Indeed, notwithstanding all the bears have been saying about the large quantities of loose leaf yet in the hands of farmers it is evident that the crop of 1881 has been pretty closely bought up, and those who want more of it have to search dilligently before they find it.

The fine weather that has prevailed for a few days past has been taken advantage of by the farmers to set the young plants, and although these as a rule are small, very many thousands of them have been planted, and the planting will continue as rapidly as possible. It is too early yet to make an estimate of the acreage of the coming crop, but it will doubtless be as large if not larger than ever before, in this county, the centre of tobacco culture, while the cultivation of the leaf will contime to spread as it has for a few years been spreading to other counties that have grown but little or none of it.
