GOOD FARMING. Methods of Harvesting Wheat.

Germantown Telegraph One of the best farmers in Pennsylvania fifty years ago was the late Daniel Hitner, of "Marble Hall," Montgomery county, and we may add that the late George Sheaff, of "Highlands," less than three miles apart, cultivated the two foremost farms in the commonwealth, though the latter was the larger by perhaps one hundred acres, it embracing three hundred and fifty acres, while the former possessed

the advantage of being superior land.

It was the custom of Mr. Hitner to engage his harvesters—" hands" being very scarce at that time-two or three months in advance to commence with both cradle and sickle, as the condition of the grain might call for, on the fourth day of July, if the state of the weather admitted of it By that time the grain was always ripe chough to begin, and he frequently had every acre of his wheat cut before a majority of the farmers had begun, and had the crop safely stacked and ready to be thrashed to meet any rise in the market. Mr. II. was not only in advance of most farmers in harvesting his grain; he stood in the front rank as a successful agriculturist in every branch of farming. His reasoning always was that manure was the first element of success, followed closely by careful, thorough cultivation and frequent stirring of the soil. The first compost heap we ever saw was upon his place. Frequently there were two or three in a single year, composed of rough manure from the stable yard, sods from fence corners and out-of way places, leaves and loose soil from the forests, muck from several large ponds in the adjacent woods, cornstalks, &c. From these compost mounds we are within bounds when we say that thousands of loads of valuable manure were hauled and spread over the land. These bodies of manure were constructed at different centres of the farm most convenient for distribution.

One point to which we refer in connection with wheat-harvesting, is the best time to cut it. Now and then the weather may make a few days' or a week's difference in the time of harvesting; but it has been settled, we think, beyond successful controversy, that early catting is to be preferred-that is to say, while the grain can be mashed between the thumb and finger, which is usually the case during the last week in June. At that time the flour produced is not only of a finer flavor and more nutritious, but by this early cutting the crop escapes the rust, which generally occurs after the 20th of June.
