ABOUT AGRICULTURE. Wheat, Grass, Corn, Oats and Other Crops Prospects.

Thomas J. Edge, secretary of the Pennsylvania board of agriculture, is in receipt of the most encouraging reports of the condition of the wheat, rye and oats crops.

When the last quarterly agricultural report was printed, about a month ago, the indications pointed to a smaller yield of wheat to the acre than last year, but since then the cereals have exhibited such improvement as to justify the prediction that considerable more bushels to the acre will be raised in the state than last year.

The oats crop in the grain promises very well. The straw is a little shorter however. The yield of grass will be considerably in excess of that of the year past.

The corn crop prospects are not encouraging, but if the weather the next two months should be satisfactory the agriculturalist may be treated to an agreeable disappointment.
