### ARABI ATTACKED.

Are Put to Fight by the British-

HIS SOLDIERS AGAIN DEFEATED. An Encounter in Which the Egptian Troops

Arabi Declared a Rebel. Major General Alison moved out of Alexandria with two regiments of infantry and a mounted squadron in the direction of Arabi Pasha's intrinchments. One of the general's aides-de-camp, with 250 rifles, pushed beyond Milaha, six miles hence, to blow up the railway. They met some of Arabi Pasha's cavalry and several some of Arabi Pasha's cavalry and several shots were exchanged. The Egyptians fled, after losing two dead and several wounded. The rifles, having finished their work, withdrew. British troops now occupy Aboukir, Arabi Pasha has levied a war tax upon the land to the nominal amount of £500,000. The khedive has received advices that Arabi Pasha is well supplied with provisions and ammunition, but that his forces are not increasing. Some correspondents having reported that they were fired upon at a village near Alexandria, a party of military proceeded thither last evening. They found the houses filled with plunder and brought forty prisoners back for trial. The British have appointed Achmet Rifaat governor of Alexandria. His duties will be mainly nominal, but his use as a figure head will enable authority to be exercised without

wounding the native susceptibilities. Germ in, Italian and French refugees continue to arrive from the interior, and barges and gunboats have been sent to Ismailia to receive them. The disturbances have driven every European out of Cairo. Many Christians have been killed there and one large party of refugees had to take the train at Kars-el-Nil on account of the threatening attitude of the savage mob at the terminal station. At the stations along the line the trains were assailed by the natives and the travelers mo-

The whole country is in a state of utter anarchy. The Arabs and the fanatical inhabitants of Tantah appear to be foremost in the perpetration of atrocities. The governor of the town, a partisan of the khedive, is well disposed toward the Europeans, but is powerless to take decisive steps to effect public security, and is governor of Port Said only in name.

The real governor is a colonel of troops, who is a devoted friend of Arabi. Neither the police nor the troops obey the governor unless they receive orders from the colonel. The governor is between two fires, receiving instructions from the khedive and from Arabi. He has been told that the khedive, having gone on board an English ship with his harem, is no longer worthy to rule in Egypt, and that the people must now choose between the khedive and Arabi. Telegrams from Arabi are dated Alexaudria. The natives are deceived by the lying reports of the rebels and believe that Arabi has been successful at Alexandria.

Arabi Declared a Rebel. A dispatch from Alexandria announces that the khedive has signed a decree dismissing Arabi Pasha and declaring him a rebel. He has also issued a general order forbidding the Egyptian army to obey the the Ezyptian people to pay him their A proclamation issued by the kindive asks the people to assist the Eaglish, who, it says, are "promoting the real interests of Egypt." Arabi Pasha's notification reads as follows:

Arabi Pasha: In consequence of your departure to Kafr el-dwar, accompanied by the army, thus abandoning Alexandria without orders, stopping railway traffic, preventing us from receiving telegrams and communications through the post and impeding the return of refugees to their homes in Alexandria, and of your persistence in war preparations and your refusal to come to us after receiving orders, I dismiss you from the office of minister of

The khedive issued the following circu lar to the army: On perusing the order for the dismissal of Arabi Pacha from the office of minister of war you will know the great motives which necessitated his dismissal. Henceforward he will have no authority over you. Whosoever agrees with his designs' and movements will have participated in his crimes. Whosoever shows obedience and conforms to our rule will deserve honor, courtesy and good renumeration. You must be aware that the country is surrounded with dangers and peri's, for the powers have agreed upon Turkish in tarvention for the reform of the country, without damaging the privileges of the firmans granted to Egypt. I am convinced that you will conform to my orders, which cannot have any object other than the welfare of the country. He who obeys my orders will be rewarded; he who does not will have to blame himself on being

THE KHEDIVE, at the Palace. Arabi's Deliant Answer. It is considered certain that Arabi will destroy Cairo unless defeated and captured. In reply to the proclamation of the khedive, Arabi appointed a minister of his own at Cairo. Preparations have been made to attack Aboukir. Arabi is moving portions of his forces in that direction. Dispatches for Arabi brought by the embargoed mail steamer were seized. It is stated that two of Arabi's colonels, acting as spies, entered the town disguised as dervishes. The khedive has requeested that a steamer proceed to Dulcigno to fetch two thousand Albanians to act as

his body-guard. The ministers have op-

posed the project, refusing to provide
