Farming is not the main business, it is rather an element in a speculation, a something which is to bring him in bread and butter till his "great ship comes in." Those who travel frequently West tell us that in most agricultural districts to which they return after a few years, they had an entire new set of faces. The original farmers have gone farther West and new men have the farms. If perchance they find old acquaintances still around it is only to see their business entirely changed. The farm which a dozen years ago was noted for its grain is now perhaps a sheep-walk, or a vast cattle pasture, or the owner has "gone into fruits," or experimented with a thousand things. The instauces where true, genuine farming, carried on in a given, determined way on a fixed plan, are the exception and not the rule. On this plan some manage, however, to make large fortunes. In rise in land, or in a fortunate cattle or grain speculation, they happen just to "hit the nail on the head," and these lucky examples turn the heads of others who cannot see why one man cannot do as well as another, and are not satisfied until they find out why they can not.

Now, the Eastern farmer is more content-at least we will speak for the Pennsylvania farmer whom we well know. You may see him now, perhaps a young man, in March and April with his oats, in May with his corn or tobacco field, in June with his grass, in July with his grain and in August and September with his potato and oorn, and you shall come back in twenty years and see him just in the sam places, his hair perhaps paler and his back not quite so straight, but still the same, only you can see evidences of "fixing and comfort everywhere-a sure in indication of a good, substantial bank account Rarely does an Eastern farmer strike on that luck which makes a man suddenly rich as it does him of the West. He does not look for or expect it ; but he goes at it as the business of his life and when industriously and intelligently pursued, it invariably rewards him with a competency, and very often leaves him a rich man.
