CONGRESS GOES HOME.

A LONG AND USELESS SESSION OVER.

Closing Scenes on the Last Day--Speaker Keifer Fails to Get the Dual Vote of Texas.

The long, tedious, profitless session of Congress came to a close on Tuesday. It began with a flourish of trumpets, continued in extravagance and spasmodic attempts at legislation, and ended in disaster. The day was characterized by few of the scenes incidental to the usual closing hours. There was no death-bed repentance, and no regrets were expressed for the errors of a mispent life. All the invalid wanted was to go, and this was that which was wanted by those who witnessed the last moments. Comparatively few were on hand for that purpose. The galleries were half empty, and those who occupied them looked on in a listless way, as if they were there killing time rather than out of any personal interest in the proceedings. Indeed, there was nothing to see. The dawdling along of the last few days had enabled the clerks to have everything in readiness, and these officials were loading about the speaker's throne the boxes containing the contents of the secretary's office in the Senate wing, waiting for the end. The president sat in the president's room, surrounded by his cabinet, signing bills. There was no hurrying to and fro of clerks and pages bearing bills and messages. There was no turning back of the hands of the clock to gain just a little more time. There was no frantic effort to push in a belated bill or resolution. The recent pettifoggery over the tax bill had floated everything through that was to get through.

If there was a constant reference to the dial of the clock it was because the hands did not move fast enough for the impatient few of the members who yet remained at the post of duty. The time of the House was chiefly whittled away in recesses and the Senate took up two hours immediately preceding adjournment in executive session. During the recesses the scene was spiritless. The schemers and jobbers hung about the closed doors of the Senate, as upon yesterday. On the floor of the House members bade each other good-bye over the rail, and in an awkward way like family visitors who are always going but don't go. When the hour came the House adjourned with a yell. The speaker got no thanks; nobody offered to give him his message. It was a mere form, but the House refused to give it without consent.

The Senate's session. When the Senate met the adjournment question was still unsettled. Some of the Republicans still favored a tilt over the tax bill, but it was useless. exit was effected by members to learn the attitude of the Senate.

After convening again the announcement was made that the president had no further use for this Congress. Speaker Keifer sat for a few seconds as if expecting something in the shape of a resolution of thanks, but to his manifest displeasure nothing of the kind was presented. It has been customary for the minority to submit such a resolution at the close of a session, but any such intention was frustrated by the remarks of several Democrats, who stated that they would protest against the adoption of such a document if introduced. After exhausting his small stock of patience the speaker, when the hands of the clock over the entrance to the hall pointed to three o'clock, rose, and, after reading a few remarks from manuscript, declared the session adjourned without a day, "emphasizing his last word with a vigorous stroke of the gavel. At the conclusion of the speaker's address a wild cheer and clapping of hands by the members on the floor gave an impetus to a similar demonstration in the galleries, and it was amid a wild hurrah and hurly-burly that the session closed. The speaker's address was as follows:

The House is about to terminate its first session. It has been an important one to the country. It has done much for the generous and kind treatment on the part of the House and with my best wishes for all its members, regardless of party, I now, as authorized and required by the concurrent resolution of the Senate and House of Representatives, declare this House adjourned without day.

The fact that the House adjourned without passing the usual resolution of thanks to the speaker excites much comment here and has highly displeased Mr. Keifer's special friends as well as given much annoyance and chagrin to the speaker himself. Congressman Morrison, of Illinois, explained the reasons of this omission on the part of the House. He said that it had been the practice to have such resolutions come from a member belonging to the party opposed to that to which the speaker belonged; that on this occasion Blackburn, of Kentucky, had the resolution of thanks in shape ready to present for the action of the House. The fact being known among Blackburn's Democratic colleagues that it was his purpose to present the resolution, he was advised that if offered the extraordinary spectacle would be witnessed of violent opposition to its adoption, and that such opposition would be successful. Governor Pennell, of Pennsylvania, of Maryland, and others have avowed their purpose of declaring the speaker's course toward them, and his general course and rulings, which they allege to have been in gross violation of the rights of the minority, as deserving of a resolution of condemnation rather than of commendation. Being advised of this determination, Blackburn pocketed the resolution of thanks, and while at the other end of the Capitol Senator Davis, president of the upper House, was determined by the thanks of that body, and by a unanimous vote, the House adjourned without so much as a "thank you" to Speaker Keifer.
