This periodical to which the "Song of the Shirt" was contributed, was set up at that time (and possibly is now) in Bouverie street, off Fleet street, London, in the printing establishment of Messrs. Brad bury & Evans, the proprietors. It appeared then every Wednesday morning at 11 o'clock on the streets, and on every Tuesday after noon the pages of Punch, singly, were submitted to the editor, Mr. Lemon. It was on one of these Tuesdays that Mr. Lemon cut out the stanza printed below in italies. It was rescued from the waste basket by a proof

reader, whose nephew now prints it in this

country. The whole poem, as written, was as follows: With fingers weary and worn, With eyelids heavy and red, A woman sat in unwomanly rags, Plying her needle and thread-

Stitch! Stitch! Stitch! In poverty, hunger and dirt, And still with a voice of dolorous pitch

She sang the "Song of the Shirt." " Work-work-work! While the cock is crowing aloof. And work-work-work,

Till the stars shine through the root; It's Oh! to be a slave Along with the barbarous Turk.

Where woman has never a soul to save. If this is Christian work! "Work-work-work

Till the brain begins to swim; Work-work-work Till the eyes are heavy and dim! Seam, and gusset, and band, Band, and gusset, and seam,

Till over the buttons I fall asleep, And sew them on in a dream! "Oh, men, with sisters dear! Oh, men, with mother and wives, It is not linen you're wearing out, But human creatures' lives!

Stitch-stitch-stitch, In poverty, hunger and dirt, Sewing at once with a double thread A shroud as well as a shirt.
