BLAINE FIGHTING MAHONE. The Ex-Secretary Strengthening Himself in Virginia With an Eye on 1884.

The straight-out Republicans in Vircounting upon his support in the resolute stand they are taking against Mahone in this campaign. The situation is some-what as follows:

Blaine never liked Mahone, but while he was a member of the Garfield cabinet he felt obliged to at least tolerate his pretensions. When the Readjuster move ment first became formidable there was general anxiety felt by politicians to know Garfield's attitude towards the new party identified with the repudiation of the bonded obligations of the state. The president was besieged by the representatives of the different parties, and urged to support that faction of the Virginia Republicans which refused to have any dealings with Mahone, Gen. Wickham, of Richmond, at the head of an influential delegation, made a special pilgrimage to the White House to persuade Garfield to ally his administration with orthodox Republicanism. For a long time the president was non-committal. Meanwhile Mahone was making good use of the fact that the administration was at least neutral in the fight, and finally he was able to demonstrate that Garfield favored Readjus ter success. During this struggle it was known that Blaine was the chief obstacle to the fusion between the administration and Mahone. When, finally, in spite of Blaine's influence, Garfield decided to uphold Mahone, the secretary of state found his mouth shut and his hands tied, as he explained to a United States senator. He opposed Mahone, but he was the only member of the cabinet who took that view of the situation, and he did not care, and could not afford to antagonize the administration. Thus matters drifted along till Blaine left the cabinet. He did not openly oppose Mahone and Mahoneism, but he gave only a hollow and perfunctory sup port. Secretly his influence was thrown in favor on the straight-outs. The situation was radically changed

when Arthur became president, and es pecially after Arthur dispensed with Blaine's services. The Arthur administration has never pretended to treat Mahone with other than cordial and open support. Mahone's claims to dictatorship in Virginia are admitted, and the whole power of executive patronage is thrown into his hauds. But one thing is lacking to make Mahone's power supreme, and that is the stubborn opposition of irreconcilable Republicans who refuse to bend the knee. If Mahone could bully or coax the straight outs to serve him, he would unquestionably control the state. He has done his best to accomplish this, and sometimes he seemed about to succeed, but he has never entirely extinguished the Republican party as such and now he seems further than ever from the goal; for accord ing to common report, Mr. Blaine, now that he is free from entangling alliances, out movement. His purpose in doing so is evident. The coalition party is by open bargain and sale. "We are for Arthur," declares Seaator Riddleberger, "because Arthur is for us." Never was there a shorter or simpler platform. No one pretends to conceal the existence of a league for the benefit of the two parties to the contract. The complet is firm, and is intended to hold good until 1884. Mahone and Riddleberger will be Arthur men in the Republican convention | Plasters, in 1884, just as they are now, and for the same concise and satisfactory reason. No wonder, then, that Blaine is against them. It is, indeed, currently reported in Virgivia that so earnest has Blaine been in this matter that the straight-outs are prepared, if necessary, to go to the presidential convention as bolters, and compel that convention to choose between Mahoneism and Republicanism. Such a move would put the convention in an awkward dilemma, and give Blaine an advantage he would know how to use. The straight-outs are already showing a significant spirit of revolt, and probably the two wings of the opposition to the regular Democracy will separate wider and wider instead of coming together in union. Blaine, meanwhile, is strengthening

himself socially in Virginia and is to-day one of the most popular men in that state. He has identified himself with its material prosperity, and won the hearts of its proud but sociable citizens by his good fellowship. He goes to Richmond this fall to deliver an address, and no doubt this visit, like his previous ones, will be made to tell in his favor. It is evident, in short, that the regular Republican organization of Virginia will send Blaine delegates to the Republican convention of 1884.
