Popular Science Monthly. "Woe to them that are at ease!" says Carlyle, but his anathema does not prevent the English village parson from outliving every other class of his country-men, not excepting the British farmer, whose peace of mind cannot always be reconciled with high rents and the low price of American wheat. Where agri-culture is what it should be—a contract between man and nature, in the United States, in Australia, and in some parts of Switzerland—the plow furrow is the straightest road to longevity; in Canada where nature is rather a hard taskmaker, the probabilities are in favor of such halfindoor trades as carpentering and certain branches of horticulture—summer farming, as the Germans call it. Cold is an antiseptic, and the best febrifage, but by no means a panacea, and the warmest climate on earth is out and out preserable even to the border lands of the polar zone. The average Arab outlives the average

Esquimaux by twenty-five years. The hygienic benefit of sea voyages, too has been amazingly exaggerated. Seafaring is not conducive to longevity; the advantage of the exercise in the rigging is more than outweighed by the cfilluvia of the cockpit, by the pickle diet, the un-natural motion and the foul weather misery and, from a sanitary standpoint, the sea air itself is hardly preferable to mountain and woodland air. The cozoon may have been a marine product, but our Pilocene ancestor was probably a forest creature.

"For what length of time would you undertake to warrant the health of a seaman?" Varnhagen asked a Dutch marine doctor. "That depends on the length of his furlough," replied the frank Hollan-der, and it will require centuries of reform to redeem our cities from the odium of a similar reproach. In victuals and vitality towns consume the hoarded stores of the country, and only the garden suburbs of a few North American cities are hygenically self-supporting. Permanent in-door work is slow suicide, and between the various shop-trades and sedentary occupations the difference in this respect is only one of degree. Factories stand at the bottom of the scale, and the dust and vapor generating ones below zero the weaver's chances to reach the average age of his species have to be expressed by a negative quantity. In France, where the tabulation of comparative statistics is carried further than anywhere else, the healthfulness of the principal town trades has been ascertained to decrease in the following order: Housebuilding huckstering, hot-bed gardening (florists). carpenter and brick-mason trades, street paving, street cleaning, sower cleaning, blacksmiths, artisansmiths (silver, copper and tin concerns), shoemaking, paper-making, glass blowing, tailor, butcher, housepainter, baker, cook, stonemasons and lapidaries, operatives of paint and lead factories, weavers, steel grindersthe wide difference between brick and stonemasons being due to the lung-infest ing dust of lapidary work, which, though an outdoor occupation, is nearly as un healthy as steel grinding. Lead paint makers have to alternate their work with jobs in the tin shop, and after all can rarely stand it for more than litteen years. Needle-grinders generally succumb after twelve or fourteen years.

ELOPING WITH HER WHITE TENANT. A Colored Boarding House Keeper Runs Away With an Iron Boulder,

Horace Cushing, a good looking, flashily dressed iron moulder, came to Norwich, Conn., from Cambridgeport a short time ago and got work in the Thamesville roll-ing mill. He boarded in the family of Charles Congdon, a young colored man who helps to wait on tables at Osprey Beach. Congdon had a pretty wife whose color is several shades lighter than his own, and Cushing fell in love with her. Mrs. Congdon reciprocated the attachment of her white boarder, but her confiding husband suspected nothing. About three weeks ago Cushing stole away from his boarding house, leaving behind as a souvenir an unpaid board bill for \$60. From then up to the present time love letters of the warmest type have passed between him and Mrs. Congdon and the infatuation of each for the other was complete. As the unsuspecting Congdon was about to leave home for his work at Osprey last Saturday morning, he was asked by his wife to take her valise to the depot and give her \$6. She was going to visit the "old folks" at Franklin, she said. But instead she went to Plainfield and thence to Providence, where her white lover met her. She passed Sunday in that city, and next day the couple went to Cambridgeport together. Mrs. Congdon carried away with her her husband's watch and about all the clothing there was in the house. Congdon first learned of his wife's faithlessness on returning home Saturday evening. He has appealed to the police for the recovery of his property. He declares he will never live with his wife again. She has no children. Cushing has been divorced from his wife.
