Four hundred dollars per year is said to be the average salary paid to the editors, reporters and printers of the United States engaged on newspaper work. Young men. you who are longing to join the band of public opinion moulders, just think of that. Four hundred dollars a year for the best slice of your life! Hadn't you better stick to the farm, the counting room, or learn a good trade, that, when you become tolerably proficient in it, will pay you remunerative wages. He wanted to know of the managing editor how in the dread future he could write a Washington letter at a point 714 miles from the national capital, and when he had never been there in his life. The managing editor cooly replied that " if he couldn't write a letter from any point in the known world on fifteen minute's notice he'd better quit the newspaper busineas before he disgraced it." He resigned that same evening and went back to his counting house stool, and his old time independent ten dollar a week air, and never asked to be a journalist again.

Some men seem to be born to do newspaper work, and they will do it if they have to live on cold hash and button their coat up to their chin while their only shirt is in the wash. And they will be just as happy, too, as the son-in-law of a monoplist with a bad cough.
