has returned from New York, where he went to get substantial aid in his campaign. He seemed to be quite resigned at the prospect of an administration defeat. A man to whom he talked reports him as saying that the administration was going to wreck and ruin both in New York and Pennsylvania, and that the Blaine men in both states were heartily glad of it. Mr. Dezendorf says that it is well understood among Blaine's friends that after the ruin is consummated then Blatne's name will be rung from one end of the continent to the other as the only man who can take the party to victory in 1884. Mr. Dezen dorf says that he will beat Mahone and the administration in his district this fall by a handsome majority, and that the straight-out Republicans will control the organization in Virginia, to the infinite disgust of the administration.
