Postage-The Government Losses. Phtladelphia Times. Stories are affoat in different parts of the state about the passage through the mails of Stalwart campaign documentsespecially a life of General Beaver in book form-at a less rate of postage than required by law. The postoffice authorities in this city declare that their skirts are clear, but at the same time admit that documents with insufficient postage have been circulated without their knowledge. It appears that in the Philadelphia postoffice, as in all the large offices of the country, the number of packages used in a day is so immense that some dependence has to be placed in the honesty of people who mail matter in large quantities, especially heavy pack-ages. Everything cannot be weighed. The campaign documents have been coming in sacks, which are emptied out among the other heavy mail matter, and when they first began coming in a few of the books and pamphlets were taken at random and weighed. They were generally found to have the required number of stamps, but it is learned from an evidently trustworthy source that the man who does most of the weighing, when he found an occasional package that was not sufficiently stamped, considered that, as the documents were issued by the Republican state committee and to help along the Republican cause, it would not be a judicious thing for him to make any fuss about it and get into a per-sonal controversy with such potential powers, so he concluded to let somebody

No later than Saturday documents were sent out that could not be passed. Even with the increased surveillance enjoined some slip through, it is stated, and the theory upon which the Republican committee appears to act is that the subordinates who handle the matter, in the present condition of political affairs will not take the responsibility of scrutinizing the stamps too closely. It is said that a way has been found of late of beat ing the matter about the bush by putting all the documents for individuals in particular cities and towns together in sacks and having these sacks unmailed, placed in the personal charge of employees on mail cars, who hand them over to the postmaster of the place, who, in accordance with instructions, mails the whole lot as local postage and distributes them. Even under this arrangement one cent postage is not enough on the books, but there has been so much sharp practice about the matter and so much circumlocution has been used that it is difficult to say who is responsible for the systematic swindling that is being carried on.
