#### No More Gate nagging.

Germantown Telegraph, Some years ago our attention was in vited to what was considered as an inevitable and remediless evil of the sagging of farm gates, and the question was repeatedly put if farmers were forever to submit to these imperfect means of en-trance to their fields, barnyards, etc.? Our reply was that the times honored "bars" must be again adopted, for all things considered, they were decidedly to be preferred to these sagging gates. What, indeed, is more annoying than a sagging gate? It is forever out of order. It may be stiffened up one day, and the next it will begin again to droop and in a little while to drag again again, and away goes a hinge, and this costs time and money to

There has lately been, however, a substitute introduced for the farm-gate, which is more efficient and convenient, and which requires no hinges, chains, clasps, or a gate post. It is simply a panel of fence made of inch boards, say four slabs six to eight inches wide, nailed together by cross-pieces of the same, the cross-pieces commencing about one foot from each end. At the back end of the panel two undressed common fence posts are set, one, the side on which the "gate to open, about an inch and a-half farther back, and the posts to be only about the same distance apart. From one post to the other suitable supports are nailed, on which this end of the panel is to rest and move. At the head of the panel an ordinary fence post is set, the holes corresponding to the ends of the slabs in the panel, which can, if necessary, be reduced a little in width and the four are to fit in the holes of the post.

This panel can be moved easily-can be carried round fully-is equally as good as a gate—has no posts to sag—no hinges to rust and break, or any iron appliances in cost more than a sixth or tenth as much as an ordinary gate. Any farmer who can handle a saw and drive a nail, ought to be able to make such an affair without farther instruction.

#### Top Dressing in Autumn. Germantown Telegraph.

The recommendation we see in many quarters to top dress grass lands in autumu we cannot wholly endorse. While we have no doubt of the efficacy of this suggestion, in a general sense, and have it advocated we think under certain conditions, some grass-lands would be more benefitted if the : pplication were made early in the spring. In fields where the ground has a tendency to heave, throw ing up the grass and exposing the roots to the direct action of the frost, autumn topdressing, which will protect the ground, is much to be preferred, and the application can be made either with the aftermath, straw or manure, as the condition of the soil may seem to require. But if the ground is not liable to heave, a coat of manure as early in the spring as it can be applied, not lumpy, and spread uniformity, will secure a heavier crop of grass. There need be no fear of the manure interfering with the mowing of the crop or the making of the hay, iuasmuch as we have found that the top dressing is soon beaten down by the rains and is quite out of reach of the operations of harvesting by the time that period arrives. We are not merely satisfied of the correctness of this view from our own experience but from that of numerous farmers whose opinions on any subject of practical farming can at alltimes be relied upon.

#### A Bear Killed by Women.
