### THE TOBACCO MARKET.

TRADE IN SEED LEAF AND HAVANA. For the Week Ending Saturday, November 12, 10 A. M.

U. S. Tobacco Journal . The market was again depressed, and transactions were very small. It would be a waste of words once more to allude at length to the cause of this unfortunate state of affairs. Sumatra tobacco has brought it about, and will continue it unti it is kept out of the market by a high

Holders of old stocks are selling at almost any figure they can obtain. The present state of the market is the most demoralized we have seen since 1874. The few buyers of new that appear ask for State, Wisconsin and Connecticut. For Pennsylvania they cannot even be induced to make offers. Let us hope—against

l:ope-that a change will soon take place. The sales of the week were about 500 cases of '80 Pennsylvania, at from 8 to 13 cents; about 600 cases of '81 Ohio, at 4 to 61 cents, and some 500 cases of '81 Connecticut at 12 cents for seconds and 28 to 32 cents for wrappers.

Sumatra-Notwithstanding the near approach of the time when the extra duty of 10 per cent. will be taken off, the market is exceedingly lively. Orders from the country are coming in very extensively, and prices range from \$1 to \$1.40. The receipts are keeping pace with the moderate demand only, most of the importers delaying their shipments until after January next, when it is expected that from three to four thousand bales will arrive in this market.

Havana-Market moderately active. Sales, mostly now, number about 500 Prices firm.

THE CORN CROP.

Estimates on the Season's Yield From All Parts of the Country. The November corn report of the department of agriculture says that deferred

frosts have made the growing period of fully average length. Condition, July 1, averaged 85; it was 83 in August, the same in September and 81 in October. Last year condition fell from 90 in July to 66 in October, presaging a loss of 450,000, 000 bushels, which was fully realized. The department has three tests of quantity produced, viz. : Comparative condition in October, yield per acre returned in No-vember and in December total product as compared with total of previous year. In October the highest indication of aggregate was 1,680,000,000 bushels, and it was stated that " later returns of product may slightly reduce but cannot materially in crease the result."

The present returns of yield make a general average close to 25 bushels per acre, which is under a medium yield, confirming the prediction of September 1, that the "beavy production of 1879 and 1880 cannot be approached under the most favorcircumstances," which was 28 1-10 bushels in the census year, while the average yield of ten years to 1880 was nearly 32; Minnesota, 21; Iowa, 186; Missouri, 184 : Kansas, 151 : Nebaska, 81.

The quality of the crop is superior throughout the South. It falls below the standard, 100, in only eighteen states and territories-only one point below in Michigan, two in Ohio, three in Nevada, five in Indiana, Vermont and Utah, six in New Jersey, eight in Colorada, nine in New York, ten in Rhode Island and New Mexico, fifteen in New Hampshire and Iowa, sixteen in Dakota, eighteen in Minnesota We are daily receiving new goods in this and twenty-two in Wisconsin. Some cor. respondents deem it too early for accurate estimate and think the outcome will be better determined by the December return of product. In former years the December return of product has been the lowest. It is not probable that the crop exceeds the above figures.
