NOTES FOR THE AUTUMN NIGHTS. Prospects for Corn-Economy on the Farm-Winter Flowers in the Window and

How They Grow. Germantown Telegraph. According to the estimate of the depart ment of agriculture the crop of Indian corn in the republic this year will average close to twenty-five bushels per acre, which is under a medium yield. The aggregate crop is given at one billion six bundred and eighty millions of bushels, These statements, which are from official sources, are compiled from the reports and estimates of reliable correspondents of the department all over the country, and will serve perhaps in some degree to explain the speculative advance in the prices of grain at Chicago and other Western grain markets some time since. The corn crop is in all respects by far the greatest and most thoroughly national of all the agricultural products of the country. Indian oorn is raised in every state and territory. However varied in soil or climate may be these sections of the country, all alike are equally capable of being successfully used for the cultivation of Indian corn. If, therefore, the foreign markets were as much in need of Indian corn as wheat, American commerce could supply that demand to an unlimited extent. As it is, however, only a small fraction of all this great product is exported to foreign countries, all the rest being consumed at home. Of course, wheat bread is always a staple article of food in the cities and towns of all parts of the country; but in the vast interior, especially in the South and West, corn meal takes the place of wheat flour as the main article of bread ; but as a general product of value corn is the most important of the earth, and is used for more general purposes for man and beast than that of any other. Economy on the Farm.

On the farm, and in all the various de tails of rural and domestic life, prudence and a just economy of time and means are incumbent in an eminent degree, The earth itself is composed of atoms, and in the most gigantic fortunes consist of aggregated items, insignificant in themselves individually considered, but majestic when contemplated in unity and as a whole. In the management of a farm, all needless expenditure should be systematically avoided, and the income made to exced the outlay as far as possible. Pecuniary embarrassment should always be regarded as a contingency of evil boding, and if contended against with energy and persevering fortitude, it must soon be overcome. Debt, with but little hope of its removal, is a millstone dragging us down and crushing the life-blood out of us. Be careful, therefore, in incurring any pecuniary responsibility which doenot present a clear deliverence with the advantages which a wise use of it ought always to insure.

A farmer who purchases a good farm and can pay down one-third of the price, give a mortgage for the other two-thirds, and possesses the heart and resolution to work it faithfully and well, enters upon the true path to success. He will labor day's exertions will lessen his indebtedness and bring him nearer to the gaol when he shall be disenthralled and becomes a freeholder in its most cheering sense. But without due economy in every department, in the dwelling as well as in the barns and in the fields, this gratifying achievement may not be reached until late in life, or may be indefinitely postponed. A prudent oversight, therefore, over all the operations of the farm, in order that everything may be done that ought to be done and nothing be wasted, will exert a powerful influence in placing a family on the high road to an early independence.

Winter Flowers in the Window, The man or woman who dislikes to see even a single pot or stand of plants or flowers in the window when they can no longer be grown out-of-doors, we would not care to be acquainted with. When we see these thoughtful, modest efforts to please the eye of the passers by, we involuntarily accord to that household not only our good wishes, but a due share of natural accomplishment that it did not even dream of evoking. While city people should not omit adorning their front winds in this way, we think that country people beyond all others can make their homes beautiful at small expense in such adornments, and would suggest that the material for this cheap and beautiful arrangement is particularly abundant at this time of the year. There are not only living plants in pots for the window sill, but colored leaves, dried ferns and grasses, and skeletonized plants, of which innumerable tasteful objects may be made. But among the cheapest and most interesting of these room and window adornments is the hanging-plants, which may be suspended from hooks and brackets, and by which the whole window can be made to look like a summer scene in the woods, although we Cough syrup. are in the midst of winter. In the closelybuilt cities some such window-gardening attempts are made, but are generally, with rare, beautiful exceptions, utter failures. Some highly ornamental China work, or some highly painted or polished "rustic" basket, is employed to hold the plants, but always evidently to the plant's misery. Plants do not seem to admire these elaborate preparations for them. They seem to understand that with them they only occupy a very inferior position in the temple of honor, and hence there is no wonder they fade away and die. In most of our country homes we find them in common pots, shells, stumps, boxes or anything that can be improvised, and always with

We remember that at our great Ceutennial exposition an exhibitor made for hanging-plants purposes the busk of the cocoanut, and we noticed and ascertained in fact that plants thrived wonderfully in this to us unique arrangement. It reminded us of what we had often read in the English horticultural periodicals, that cocoanut refuse is an excellent material for the growth of plants. We are all familiar with the cocoanut, but all do not know that the nut is enclosed in a heavy, spongy covering or husk of an inch or more in thickness. These husks are cut across in the middle and make two little baskets, and can be easily suspended with wire. we have already said, there is a great fertility power in this covering, and there is the basket at the same time, thus securing two desible things where only one to most people was apparent.

Many beautiful plants and flowers can

be had all the winter through in this way at very little cost in time or money-at least, so little as not to be worth mentioning with the pleasure and satisfaction af forded to all, alike to those who provide these most desirable natural ornaments and the obliged public who cordially wel-come the heartfelt treat as they pass along. Now, too, is the time, and none made about securing them.
