The Mysterious Highgate Murder Case, in which the defense claims that the Victim Still Lives. HARRISBURG, Nov. 25.—The testimony for the commonwealth in the mysterious Highgate murder case, in which William Andrews is charged with murdering and burning his wife was concluded at twelve o'clock to-day and the defense went to the jury without submitting any evidence. The commonwealth proved by expert testimony that the charred matter found in the burned building was of an animal character and that the blood of the defendant's clothes was the blood of either an animal or a human being.

CONDENSED TELEGRAMS. Little Flashes From the Electric Wire. "Evacuation Day" was celebrated by the veterans of the war of 1812, in New York to-day, the American flag being hoisted in the Battery.

WILMINGTON, Del., Nov. 25.—Sheriff Martin, who was chosen at the recent election, had his first whipping at New Castle, this morning. Isaac Hayden, Frank Mullen and James Stewart, convicted of larceny, were given 10 lashes each, and Robert Lynn and Henry Magruder, for highway robbery, forty lashes each. Magruder suffered considerably, but Lynn affected to care very little.

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Nov. 25.—After a very thorough examination of the case the grand jury have ignored the bill against John A. Cockrell, editor of the Post Dispatch, about a month ago, and it is not likely that any further action will be taken in the matter.

ALBANY, N. Y., Nov. 25.—The remains of the late Thurlow Weed arrived on the steamer Drew early this morning and were taken to St. Peter's church, where they were placed at the foot of the chancel. The coffin was opened and the body viewed by an immense crowd which filed past the catafalque all morning.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 25.—A capias was issued to-day for the arrest of Rev. Thos. A. Farnley, charged with libelling Wm. G. Estlin. The latter was a candidate at the recent election for select council and was defeated.

WILMINGTON, Del., Nov. 25.—A boiler at the Pusey & Jones works exploded to-day, injuring three men, one named Hawkins, it is thought, fatally.

NORRISTOWN, Pa., Nov. 25.—While fighting a lamp last night Mrs. Abel Halldeman, of Centre Square, this county, accidentally set fire to her dress, and was burned so badly that she died at 5 o'clock this morning.
