A MINISTER IN POLITICS.

The Rev. T. A. Fernley Charged With Slandering a Candidate.

The Rev. Thomas A. Fernley, a well known Methodist Episcopal minister in charge of a church in Roxborough, has been dropped a quiet word into his ear. It is alleged that he related stories of how Mr. Estrekin abused his family and indulged in excesses which would fit him to represent the ward in the upper legislative branch of the city government.

It is claimed, to the Rev. Mr. Fernley, and numerous persons volunteered to appear in court and tell what they know. The matter was placed in the hands of a council of Deacons, who, after hearing some of the statements, decided that Mr. Estrekin had good cause for an action for slander and defamation of character. Accordingly an affidavit was prepared and a capias will be served upon Mr. Fernley in a civil suit for damages, and he will be arrested.

"The desire of my client is not to obtain money," said Attorney Dever, "but to have the matter brought into court so that his character may be cleared of such stains which the reverend gentleman has cast upon it. Mr. Estrekin has been engaged in business for thirty years, and this is the first time a wrongdoing has been charged to him."

The Rev. T. A. Fernley is one of the best known of the ministers in this city. He has filled pulpits all over Philadelphia and vicinity, and is a prominent man at the Monday meetings. He is naturally aggressive, and an untiring worker when he enters into a contest. Great interest will attach to the case because of the prominence of the preacher.
