The gentleman dab-bled in politics in a quiet way, and it is charged that his efforts in aid of his friends were very efficacious. At the late election William G. Entreken, a photographer in Manayunk, was a candidate for select council, and was backed by the Independent Republicans and Democrats against Colonel Charles Thomas Jones, the regular Republican. The Rev. Mr. Fernley espoused the cause of Colonel Jones, and whenever he met any of the members of his flock or neighbors he dropped a quiet word into their ears. It is alleged that he related stories of how Mr. Entrekin abused his family and indulged in excesses which would illy fit him to represent the ward in the upper legislative branch of the city government. The seed sown by the wayside grew and showed that this style of campaigning was a good one. When the returns were counted up after the election it was found that Colonel Jones was elected. Soon after this stories began to reach the ear of the defeated candidate which reflected seriously upon his character. He traced their authorship, it is claimed, to the Rev. Mr. Fernley, and numerous persons volunteered to appear in court and tell all they knew. The matter was placed in the hands of Counsellor P. A. Dever, who, after hearing some of the statements, decided that Mr. Entre-kin had good cause for an action for slauder and defamation of character. Accord-
