DEATH IN A BURNING BUILDING. Two Little Children Destroyed in a Tene-ment at Johnstown.

About six o'clock Friday morning fire broke out in a Cambria iron company's tenement, the First ward, Johnstown, Pa. The building was occupied by four families, among them that of Hiram Berkebile. In a few minutes the tenement, together with a single dwelling and one of the company's stables, were enveloped in flames and, notwithstanding the united efforts of the first companies. five fire companies, were soon reduced to ashes. At the time of the fire Mrs. Berkashes. At the time of the fire Mrs. Berkebile and her five children were asleep.
The husband was at work. The mother
saved herself and baby by jumping from
the upper portico. The two oldest children, a boy of thirteen and a girl of ten
years, also succeeded in escaping, but during the excitement the other two children
little Willia and Sarah, aged respectively little Willie and Sarah, aged respectively four and seven years, were overlooked until too late. When the debris was cleared away the bodies of the little ones were found in the cellar, burned into a crisp. All the furniture was destroyed. The stable was opened in time to save the live-stock, some forty-eight horses and mules. All the buildings belonged to the Cambria iron company. Their estimate of damages is \$5,000; fully insured.
