AN IMPROVED CATTLE CAR.

Transporting Live Stock Without Injury. The York Daily notices that 38 head of fine cattle have arrived there from Chicaro for William H. Miller. Sixteen head were brought in Kohler's improved cattle car. They left Chicago last Wednesday at 6 p. m., being nearly four days on the road. Each steer had a compart ment to itself, and could either stand up or lie down as it pleased without the least danger of becoming injured, and where it was regularly watered and fed with mixed corn and oats during the transit of the train. This, the first trial of the improved car, has proved a perfect success, the machinery for delivering the water and feed into the troughs working like a charm. Upon the arrival of the train a number of persons were presen and were more than surprised at the fine condition of the animals. Their good condition demonstrates the fact that cattle can be comfortably transported in

Kohler's improved car. This car is of the ordinary stereotypes open work pattern, 42 feet 8 inches long inside, 8 feet wide and 6 feet 2 mehes high from the deck to the roof. Inside the car is a false deck which can be raised or lowered from the outside by means of cranks, thus making, when hoisted into place, a double deck car, each deck having a space three feet one inch high above it. and suitable for the carrying of sheep, hogs or other small live stock. On top of the roof, running lengthwise, are the water tanks and feed bins, having a capacity respectively of 350 gallons of water are forty-eight bushels of oats, a quantity estimated as sufficient to feed a carload of live stock for a period of seven days, giving each animal three meals a day of half a peck at a time. Leading from the water tanks and feed bins are tubes which conduct the food to cast iron feed boxes placed before each animal, and which, when not in use, are turned up right so as not to project into or beyond the sides of the ear. The water tanks are so constructed that they can be packed with cork shavings to prevent the water freezing in cold weather. This car is calculated to accommodate eighteen head and give each animal pleuty of stall room to lay down and rise up in, each being separated from the other by stout canvas partitions, which, when not in use, or when the car is turned into a double decker, are rolled up against the roof of the car by means of cranks operated from the outside; but, in case of an emergency, twenty-four head can be crowded into a single car. Built beneath the platform of the car is a capacious box to be used for the purpose of carry ing the cranks and tackle necessary to operate the car. When the car is turned into a double-decker, there are two rows of iron feed boxes, one for each deck, both being connected with the feed bins and water tanks by sepa rate tubes. Beside being used for stock purposes, the car can also be utilized to carry freight of any kind without any alteration or trouble. To push the interests of this invention a stock company has been formed by capitalists, under the name of the Koehler Improved Cattle Car company, with heidquarters in New York, the officers eing Hon. Chauncey F. Black, of York, l'a., president, and E. D. Saxton, of New York, secretary and treasurer. Whether

very destructive upon the bark of young fruit trees. We have known instances when the whole orchards of young apple trees have been more or less damaged by these animals gnawing off the tender bark and thus seriously interfering with their growth, appearance and value. In regard to mice, the remedy we see most gen-erally suggested is the stamping of snow firmly around the trees, as the mice, it is claimed, attack the trees under, not above, the snow. This may or may not be of advantage. But the remedy we offer is really a remedy, and we doubt if anyone who has tried it properly has failed. It is simply to bandage up the stems of the tree with any cotton or woolen cloth, if of muslin with two or three wrappings, letting the bandage go into the ground an inch or two, and six or eight inches above ground, and tie up. This should be renewed every autumn if necessary, until the trees are large enough not to be injured. Those who are in earnest for a remedy will try this and save their trees but it will be too much trouble for others to devote a couple of hours to this labor annually, and they will rather run the risk with the mice.

This method will keep out the borer also, as we have stated upon several occasions. Rabbits can gnaw, when the stems are small enough, two feet from the ground, and would require the bandage to be much higher. Tarring would help as a protection, but we have known in many cases the simple bandage to be all sufficient, and the tar to be injurious to the trees. But the best way to treat rabbits is to feed them. They never injure trees except when snow covers the ground and they have nothing to live on. For this purpose cabbage, turnips, apples or any vegetable offal will answer, and especially hay, of which the rabbit is very fond.
