FRIGHTENED BY STRANGE NOISES.

SATURDAY MISCELLANY

Ghostly Doings which Led to the Issuing of a Writ of Habeas Corpus-Spirits Who Will Not Down.

The family of Anthony Mors, an untutored German, of Syracuse, N. P., have been frightened and disturbed for more than a month past by strange noises in their house. The noises are heard in the night, rousing them from slumber. Some times they are nothing more than gentle raps, but at other times there come tremendous thumps that shake the house and rattle the plaster down upon the floor. These noises have been heard in the street and by the neighbors.

News of the disturbance in Mors' house spread through the city, and crowds have of late assembled there at nightfall blockading the street, filling the doorway, and taking possession of the place, police were called upon, and a detail has lately been sent every night to preserve the peace and protect the family. The visitors included those who did not be-lieve in ghosts and who jeered whenever the mysterious noise was heard; others who belived that spirits caused the noise, and some of a scientific turn, who believed that they could detect and expose the source of the disturbance. They insulated the beds, placing them on glass plates, and then, causing the whole family to retire, and each member watched to see that none of them produced the sounds by mechanical or electrical action. Still the sounds continued. They always occur about 10 p. m., and are confined to one of the apartments in the first story.

Mis. Havrouck, Mr. Mors' slater, died in New York four years ago, leaving her little girl Mary to Mors' care, giving him \$500 as a consideration and also \$500 to the child, to be paid to her when she should become of age. A few months ago Mary was taken away from Mo:s' by di-rection of the bureau of labor and charity, on the ground that she was not properly treated, and was placed in St. Vincent's orphan asylum. Mors' declares that the noises are made by his deceased sister demanding the return of the child, and that they will not cease till she is re-stored to them. She is now 10 years old A few nights ago the noises were so loud that Mors took his revolver and fired it in the room; but they did not stop, and he says he heard his sister's voice dis tiuctly. He made affidavit to these statements, and procured from County Judge Beigel a writ of habcas corpus for the child, who was brought before the court. She was closely questioned, and said she wanted to stay in the asylum. The court remanded her to the institution.

The bureau of labor and charity has informed Mors that he can have the girl in three months, providing that the rappings cease.
