Dr. 1 aul schooppe in Sing Sing Prison. John P. G. Smith, of Port Jervis, N. Y., was tried for forgery in New York city and scutenced in June, 1880, to state pris-on for five years. In April last an effort was made to procure a pardon from Goveroor Cornell. A paper drawn by the prisoner was prescuted by Hon. A. C. Butts, of Monticello, together with letters from many prominent persons expressing the belief that Smith was the victim of a conspiracy. Official investigation, however, shows that he had been convicted of the murder of Miss Steinecke at Carlisle, Pa., in 1877, and sentenced to be hanged, but on a new trial was acquitted. At that time he was known as l'aul Schoeppe. He afterwards went to Chicago and became a bookkeeper. Soon after he committed frauds and fled to Baltimore. In that city he was arrested and committed to jail for obtaining money on false pretences. On the Chicago authorities being notified a requisition was procured and Smith was taken to that city, where he was convicted and served out a term of three years at Joliet prison. Smith at one period claimed to be Count Schulenberg. He is still in Sing Sing

Murdered by Her Drunken Lover. Charles L. Lamb, son of Dr. C. L Lamb, a wealthy and highly respected citizen of Hannibal, Mo., while very drunk late on Friday night went to the house of a man named Hull, living at Dreary Hollow, a mile or two from St. Louis, to see a woman, with whom, it is said, he was formerly intimate, but who had recently married Hull. Lamb became abusive and was ordered out of the house. He refused to go, and in a scuffle to put him out he knocked the woman down. Hull then struck him with a poker knocking him out of the door, which was closed on him. The drunken man then reeled around on the side of the house and discharged a pistol through the window, the ball taking effect in Mrs. Hull's left side, killing her almost instantly. Lamb fled en a Wabash train, but was captured. He is a grandson of Claiborne F. Jackson, the noted rebel governor of Missouri, and is very highly connected.
