A Description of the Baltimore Millionaire's Magnificient New Rasidence. The magnificent private residence for Ross R. Winans, the well known millioniare, on St. Paul street, Baltimore, the erection of which was commenced last spring, is now completed. The workmen are putting on the finishing touches, car-pets, etc., are being laid and by next week the dwelling will be ready for occupancy. The structure is said to be the finest private house south of New York and will be excel in point of beauty and elegance any dwelling in Baltimore. A number of invited guests, accompanied by Mr. Winans, visited the house on Thursday to make an inspection. The lot upon which the house stands is 125 feet front by 122} teet deep. The house itself is 66 feet long by 75 feet deep, and is five stories high, with sloping mansard roof. The style is French renaissance and the exterior resembles very closely an old Belgian French chateau, with clinging ivy and bistorical associations. What remains of the lot has been transformed into a beau tiful garden at a cost of \$30,000. Around the yard and building is a brick enclosure. The interior of the dwelling is as magnificent as the fancy of the owner can make it. It is of satin red oak and ebouized cherry woods, inlaid and carved, and

in each room there are costly beveled mir-

rors. The hall runs the full length of the

building and upon its ornamentation and

decoration have been expended alone \$50,-

The cost of the entire building and garden when fluished will be about \$500,000. In the construction Mr. Winans ordered that no expense be spared. There are rooms in the basement for sixteen servants, also laundry, kitchen, boiler-pit, store room and drying room, and upon the first floor there is a handsome ball room, drawing, reception, dining rooms, parlor and library. The other floors are to be taken up with bed rooms. The most striking features in the architectural appearance of the house are two towers, one at the front and the other at the rear. They reach only as far as the cornice, and remind one of the pictures of Kenilworth castle. At the side of each of the towers rise four circular chimneys, unique in design and made of pressed red brick, with jet-black cement. The material of which the house is built is pressed brick and brownstone and the blending of color is rich and perfect. Mr. Winaus will move from his Hollins street mansion and occupy the residence on St. Paul street as soon as it is finished. The old mansion will be occupied by his sister. The new building was designed by McKim, Mead & White, of New York, the architects who designed the Vanderbilt mansion, and the builder was Blake, of Baltimore.
