An Old-Time Husking Bee. Well, here we are in the big fragrant barn, with the forty lads and lasses. There has been a clean sweeping between the mows, and the floor is as neat as the deck of a man of-war. It is 8 o'clock of a November evening-sharp without, to be sure, and a bit frosty within, but what care we, with our coats and caps and shawls and mittens on? A goodly number of lanterns have been hung from the beams and over the doors and on a wire stretched between the mows, and it is light enough to see the red corn peoping through the curled edges of the husks, as they lie piled up in a great heap mid way of the floor-light enough to see the glow of health on the cheeks of the boys and girls and to reveal the traces of the paint pot and the burnt match and the powder rag, if there were any there. The good man of the-barn and his buxom dame go about shaking hands with the young people, and asking after the "folks," and when their "huskin' is comin' off?" and how many cows they are milking, and so forth, without once troubling their heads about "introducing" their guests, or seeing that they are "paired off," which is a spontaneous proc ss in country gatherings, and always happens to itself. Later in the evening it is expected that more of the old folks will drop in, just to see how the husking come out, and sample some of the good cheer. Their days of gratuitous activity have long since passed, but they

themselves" in the profitable combina-

tion of business and pleasure! When the guests have all arrived the boys go to work and pull great armfuls of hay from the mow, which they spread around the heap of corn. Then each seats himself by his favorite girl, draws a bundle of husks into the hay between them and the husking begins. The victorious side is first served with refreshments. Great platefuls of doughnuts and "fritters," and slices of snowy cake, pies cut m generous pieces, cider and apples, puts and home-made candy are passed around. The "old folks" come stamping in by twos or threes, and are immediately assailed with conflicting stories of individual prowess and associate achievement, and then stuffed with good things to stop their laughing.
