FARMER AND GARDENER. A Hint Worth Remembering.

Germantown Telegraph. It is well to bear in mind that grains, grasses, fruit trees, vines, &c., which usually flourish well in higher latitudes than our own, are always sure to do well with us. One thing is certain—they will prove perfectly hardy; and the reverse is generally the case when we attempt to adopt Southern products. What may grow and flourish and prove profitable as far south as North Carolina may be extremely uncertain here. The South, therefore, has a wider field of supply and recuperation than we have even here in a middle state, but we have the advantage that if a grain, plant or vine is once established here, it become far more permanent, and we may add, more reliable. In the extreme North—Canada for instance-the number and variety of farm and garden products are limited to a very few, comparatively, but they are more dependable than with our larger and more extended catalogue. In their cultivation, too, much skill and success is shown from published statements, as well as from per-sonal ones furnished by travelers. But the question may be asked, is it not more advisable to confine ourselves to fewer products that are common here and sure to do well, and cultivate them with more assiduity and care, than to divide and weaken our efforts among so many? We are opposed to specialties, to which many farmers in different sections adhere, and have always been advocates of a mixed husbandry; but we should make our own selection from the general catalogue for which our farms may be more particularly adapted.

Trapping Muskrats. Early spring-that is, as soon as the frost is out of the ground—these destruc-tive and active animals begin their operations and play havoc with the roots of the grass, winter spinach beds, lettuce plants, &c., and this is about the best time to begin trapping them. We notice various modes recommended in agricultural exchanges for ridding premises of the muskrat, but they possess very little merit. As we have a small fish pond, and of course a small stream of water to supply it, we are naturally more or less pestered with these rats, and sometimes they have done a great deal of mischief. We have tried various modes of trapping them, but found nothing to compare with the common unbaited steel trap. If there is a springlet or run it will be noticed that the muskrat will always, if shallow enough, use that to the last inch to reach its feeding ground. If the trap is laid on the bottom in this, with no bait, fastening the trap with a piece of wire to a stake pushed in the ground, the arrangement is complete and a certain thing. We captured one season eight in our garden in this way. After the seventh, there was only a portion of a foreleg in the trap, but the next morning we found a fellow with only three legs. The following season we got two more, and after that they did not make their appearance for several years, and when they did the same plan was renewed. Wherever the trap was set it was always placed under water. But sometimes they pass from a pond or stream directly into the bank under the water. If so, mark the direction of their holes and dig in the bank from seven to nine feet trops the entrance, and it is almost certain to catch them. The depth at which their nests are made from the surface of the ground is from eighteen inches to two feet. We have captured
