A PRISONER'S RUSE.

Eating Scap and Becoming so Emaciate That the Doctors Were Deceived. A case almost unprecedented in Ohio has just occurred in the office of Governor Foster, at Columbus, which is no more or less than the revocation of a pardon unconditionally granted by Governor Foster on the 19th of October last. The party is Isaac Knapp, who at the October term. 1877, of the Sandusky common pleas court, was convicted of murder in the second degree and sentenced to the peni tentiary for life. The pardon was granted on the certificate of Dr. Gay, who said the convict was suffering from tuberculous degeneration of the lungs and was in imminent danger of death. Warden Thomas

coincided with the views of Dr. Gay. It has been recently ascertained that the pardon was secured by fraud, and that Knapp had been chewing soap for some time in the prison, thus causing the frethy, sickly hue of his countenance, which might be mistaken for tuberculous degeneration of the lungs. Immediately after reaching home Knapp boasted how he "beat the pen," as he termed it, and in a few days he was apparently as well and hearty as any man in Fremont. He anti-fat process, and dilated on the way he ate the hard soap furnished to convicts. Since his pardon he has been in all kinds of trouble at Fremont, ruling everybody and everything with a high hand, and it was on the petition of a large number of prominent citizens of that place that the action of the governor was predicated.

But once before in the history of Ohio has such a course been taken. During the administration of Governor J. D. Cox, a similar thing was done and the prisoner returned to the peuitentiary. Legal advice taken by Governor Foster has been to the effect that as the pardon was secured by fraud, it is without any force or effect and Knapp was, therefore, an escaped convict. He has been taken into custody.
