SOMETHING ABOUT WHEAT. Some Surprising Statistics From England

Phil'a Record. A good many farmers in this country will be somewhat surprised to hear what one of their number, E. A. Merritt, who occupies the consul generalship at London has to say respecting the superiority of Great Britain over this country in the production of cereals. He says that the standard average production of wheat, for example, in the United Kingdom is 29\frac{1}{2} bushels per acre, while in the United States, according to late official figures, the average is only 12.4 bushels. Maize is not raised in that country, and rye is of so little importance that its acreage is only one-half per cent. of the land under cereal cultivation; but the returns given for barley and oats also exhibit a larger yield per acre as compared with corresponding returns in American agriculture, and they bear testimony to the high cultivation of the land and the skill and labor of the English farmer. The agricultural statistics of the United Kingdom for the year 1882 show the wheat acreage to be 3,003,915; oats, 2,833,815, and barley, 2,255,139, a gain of acreage in wheat of 7.1 per cent The average yield of wheat is given at about 80,000,000 bushels, and General Merritt calls particular attention to this point, as furnishing a contrast which may hereafter be of value to our farmers, that "with the wheat acreage twelve times greater, than Great Britain, the United States do not produce six times as much The crop of wheat in France in comparison of the acreage also exceeds that of this country. In 1882 the yield in France amounted to 328,306,618 bushels, and the average per acre was 18.37. The crop of 1881 was 274,699,385 bushels. The crop in 1881 in the United States was short, and amounted to only 398,000,000 bushels. That of 1882 is set down at about 518,000,000 bushels. The figures show that the yield of wheat in France per acre greatly exceeds that in best wheat-producing states. As exhibiting the wheat production of some of the countries of Europe in the year 1881, according to late consular reports the yield of Denmark is given at 3,143,928 bushels; of Germany, 72,069,865 bushels, besides 15,715,805 bushels of German wheat (spelt) and 213,-850,000 of one grained wheat. In the prov inces of Italy there were harvested in 1881, 100,708,461 bushels of wheat. The total average annual production of grain during the years 1871-80 for Austria Hungary was 97,301,280 bushels, an average of 12.1 per acre. The average aunt a' production of Roumania is estimated at 43,000,000 bushels. According to the estimates of a government commission appointed to investigate the condition of agriculture in Russia, the yield of wheat in that country and Poland, exclusive of Don Cossackodistricts in 1878 was 293, 702,000 bushels. In Algeria 44,017,349 bust els of wheat were produced in 1880. Taking year by year, France seems to be the only country whose yield of wheat for and flowers. the last ten years exceeds in proportion to population that in the United States COUGH SYRUP. for the same period. The area of France is less than that of the four states of Iowa, Missouri, Illinois and Indiana, and the population of that country is less than that of the United States by one quarter. Most of the other European countries are, and must remain, importers of the cereals, excepting perhaps Russia. And as the United Kingdom, with a population of 37,000,000, requires besides its own wheat product about 110,000,000 bushels in addition to supply home needs, and this supply must principally be from this country, it is evi dent that our agriculturalists will be fully repaid for laboring to bring the soil up in productiveness to the highest standard
