## EDUCATIONAL.

**THE HIGH SCHOOLS OF THE STATE.**

Reviews of the Annual Report of the State

State Superintendent of Public

Instruction.

For the YEAR 1882.

In this third and closing paper we de-

sire to call attention to the importance

and necessity of the high schools that

have been established in the State.

It is a question how far the State should

conduct its course of education. Some

advocate the theory that it should con-

duct itself merely to the rudiments, the three

"R's." Reading, Writing and "Arithme-

tic." But it is plain that no such fixed line

can be drawn. In the large towns espe-

cially where the schools are kept open

more months in the year than in the coun-

try, children can go over a more extended

course of study before they reach the age

when they should be put to the practical

pursuits of life. The very first requisite

of course, is, that they should be instruc-

ted most thoroughly in the common branches

first, and perhaps there might be an im-

provement on this point in our lower grade
