BOOTH'S SUCCESS.

The Great Actor's Triumphs and Honors in Berlin, London Era.

The original contract was made with Mr. Scherenberg for Mr. Booth to appear at the Victoria theatre on the 16th, but on arrival it was found that on Christmas day he had produced a grand spectacular piece entitled "Frau Venus." This was olaying to such great business that he was desirous of postponing Mr. Booth's ap pearance. Of course this could not be seded to, as he had already made other agements to follow. However, as Mr. Sooth did not wish to break the run of coess at the Victoria if it could be ided, his manager, Miller, at once set to work to make other arrangements, and was successful in securing an opening for im at the Residenz theatre, which is tter-class house than the other, and, as better terms were made with Mr. Neumann (the director), the arrangement was a satisfactory one all round. Mr. Booth opened at Hamlet on Thursday, 11th, to a house crowded in every part. The crown prince occupied the royal box, attended by his suite, and followed the play most attentively. At the termination of the piece, and after being recalled twenty-four times, Mr. Booth had to receive a deputation of artists and literati who had witnessed the performance. The crown prince also complimented him personally. The performance of the company was in German, and exceedingly satisfactory, the play going without a hitch. The papers are unanimous in placing Booth in front of Salvini and Rossi (both favorites in Berlin), and it is difficult to get a place unless booked the day before.
