MARY ANDERSON BLACKMAILED. A Fruitiess Actempt Stade by a Disreputable Physician of 1 Ittsburgh,

An attempt to blackmail Mary Ander son, the actress, by Dr. A. G. Marshall, a skilled but worthless physician of Pittsburgh has just became known, although the attempt was made some two months ago. Dr. Marshall, about six months ago, was released from the penitentiary, where he had served a term of four years for being implicated in an abortion which became a notorious case. Some time in the early part of January he wrote to Dr. Hamilton Griffin, Miss Anderson's stepfather, saying that he had in his posses sion some letters written by Miss Anderson, which greatly compromised her. No notice was paid to this letter, and Dr. Marshall wrote again, saying that he would certainly have the letters published unless he was paid \$4,000 for them. Dr. Griffin then sent the letters to Chief of Police Heisel, with instructions to look up Dr. Marshall, find out his character and have him prosecuted for blackmail. He further stated that he had a picture of Miss Anderson in a state that would not be pleasant to be made public, and that unless he was paid \$10,000 copies of the pictures would be taken in reduced size, put in covers, etc., and sold. Heisel, after a little investigation, determined to turn the matter over to the post office authorities and Special Agent Coates is now working it up.
