STATE LEGISLATION.

PROCEEDINGS AT THE STATE CAPITAL.

The Recorder Bill Passed in the Senate—The Report of the Delaney Investigation Exonerates Him From Fraud.

HARRISBURG, April 18.—After a contest of over an hour, and the defeat of all efforts to amend the recorder bill, it was passed finally by a unanimous vote; the bill, as passed, repeals the recorder act of 1878, and provides that it shall go into effect on approval. The bill was amended in the Senate, and it will go back to the House for concurrence.

In the Senate Mr. Emery presented the Delaney report. It concerned him from complicity in frauds on the state, sets forth that the supplies for the Senate barber shop have been procured in violation of the law and administered by a committee of the Senate.

A MURDERER HANGED.

James Treglow Executed at Morrisett, New Jersey.

MORRISSETT, N. J., April 18.—James Treglow was hanged on the gallows this morning for the murder of Minnie Chirgwin at Port Oram, in June, 1882. The prisoner passed a sleepless night though he appeared cheerful this morning.

DEATH OF AN Aged Woman.

Suspicious Circumstances Surrounding the Death.

TAUNTON, Mass., April 18.—Ellen Hall Asey, aged 65 years, was found dead in her house in East Taunton this morning with indications that she had been murdered. She was found lying with her head in a tin basin surrounded by pools of blood with a hole in her forehead. William Flynn was found in an adjoining room severely cut in the forehead and his story is that Timothy aged 19, and John aged 22, the sons of the murdered woman, were engaged in an altercation last evening, when he interfered and was struck on the head by Timothy with a chair. The boys put him in bed, and the last he remembers was the old woman standing over him and trying to stanch the flow of blood.

He Forgave His Murderer.

NORTH ADAMS, Mass., April 18.—R. A. Savage, who was shot on Wednesday by James Barrett, died this morning. Barrett was arrested and committed without bail. Savage on his death bed forgave Barrett for shooting him and said he hoped "God would forgive him (Savage) for all he had done."

GETTYSBURG, Pa., April 18.—Ground was broken here this morning for the Gettysburg & Harrisburg railroad amid the firing of cannon, the ringing of church bells and the cheers of the people.
