TOBACCO.

Sumatra vs. Domestic Growths of Seed Leaf Western Tobacco Grower.

The editor of that detestable New York sheet which is prescribed by nearly every member of the tobacco trade of New York seems intent on giving Sumatra tobacc an importance as a factor of trade in this country that it does not possess. He pictures the New York market as dull and inactive for domestic leaf, and rampant and anxious to buy Sumatra, even if \$1.60 per pound has to be paid for the choice of the importations. He says the crop will aggregate 120,000 bales, which, at 200 pounds to the bale, is equivalent to 24,-000,000 pounds. As the foreign trade takes the greater portion of this tobacco, and at terms which can not but prove as satisfactory to holders as those that can be realized in this country, now that a tax of 85 cents per pound has been placed on it, it is hard to see how Sumatra tobacco cau paralyze trade in home growths, especially as about 100,000,000 pounds of which is required annually to meet the wants of the home and foreign trade.

The frothings of this editor, we think, are given off with the hope of discouraging holders of seed leat, so that packers may have everything their own way, for what other purpose is this advice given to packers: "You can't pay too little for the leaf you buy ?"

Fortunately planters are not compelled to sell their tobacco at whatever is offered as trade has revived wonderfully since the sattlement of the tax question, and is likely to prove prosperous for some time to come until another agitation is set on foot, which it is fervently hoped, will not be in this generation. A few months ago it looked as if holders of seed leaf would in many instances be compelled to part with their holdings at whatever could be obtained before the year was well ad vanced, but now sales are quite brisk, and while prices are not as high as was obtained in previous years, yet they gener ally prove satisfactory to holders, who understand and appreciate the situation, and are willing to make reasonable sacrifices to facilitate trade.
