JEFFERSONIAN ASSOCIATIONS.

Their Aid in Party Organization. LANCASTER, Pa., May 1, 1883. To the Members of the Jeffersonian Democrati Association of York:

GENTLEMEN: I acknowledge the notifi-cation by your president, Hon. Chauncey F. Black of my election to honorary mem. bership in your organization; my appre ciation of the honor conferred by your partiality and my acceptance of such membership are quickened by an examination of the documents which I have received, setting forth the objects of your association and the testimony of the distinguished Democrats who have tinguished Democrats who have been in-

vited to its fellowship. Bearing the honored name of him who was the author of the Declaration, the foremost exponent of our constitutional system, the founder of the Democratic party and who never abated his faith in the government of the people by them-selves, you may with righteous confidence in the perennial efficacy of his principles reassert them as a living political faith.

My present official concern for the most nearly perfect organization of the Democratic party in this state will justify me in expressing the high estimate which I set upon the influence of a net work of such associations as yours. If their organization were extended throughout the state their rolls would represent a great body of its most intelligent and active Democrats, whose united thought and ac tion could not fail to powerfully and beneficially influence the sentiment of the party. The effect would be to educate speakers and writers who could appeal with conviction to the individual judgment of the voters at a time like this, when in the reaction against political "bosses' and "machines" the power of such appeal to common sense and common honesty is greatly beightened.

It is the happy fortune of those who hold to the Democratic faith that they can afford to "go up the river of time to the first fountains of good and evil." It only needs that the generations should know the Jeffersonian principles to vote them into effect.

The time has come in this state to prove the superior wisdom of an organization in detail, "from the people up." In that work I recognize no more important factor than associations which will not disband after an election nor wait for the bugle of a convention to call them into action but which will labor unceasingly, month after month, -and especially in the season when men's minds are least inflamed with party zeal and most open to the truth dispassionately stated-to spread the fundamental ideas of Democracy. Besides the immediate practical aid

furnished to the regular party organiza-tion, such a system of voluntary associa tions would promote party unity by direct-ing the attention of Democrats everywhere to the vital, underlying basis of their principles; they would present open doors to those who, through Labor, Grange, or to those who, through Labor, Grange, or Auti-monopoly associations, now with hon est purpose, but scattering and ineffectual protest against evils which have bee infused into our institutions only by de partures from the Jeffersonian ways; they would successfully appeal to the pride and interest of the individual voter in the exercise of his rights and privileges as the this sterling invigorant and anti-tebrile mediparty which has maintained the inheritance of Jeffersonian tolerance and freedom, and that which is the legitimate heir to the spirit of proscription and tyranny that has periodically appeared under new names and forms, but with unchanged purposes, and has never failed to meet with popular condemnation when fairly submitted to the decision of the ballot box; and the young men of the State and country, disgusted with the debauchery of Repub lican rule, would naturally flock with an enthusiasm to a standard which has emblazoned upon it the promise and the patency, as well, of better things. You have anticipated one objection

which might arise to your association by the declaration that you will "as an organized body, take no part in struggles at primary or delegate elections, nor suffer any person, under any circumstances, to make his membership a stepping stone to public office."

With your surposes thus clearly defined and approved by the eminent authorities who have united with you to promote them, it is no occasion for surprise that since your first organization there has been such a general response of approval. Similar and sister associations are forming in different quarters of the state, old establish ed party societies are taking on the name and taking up the spirit of yours, until their example has excited emulation even in other states.

With a general Jeffersonian revival, there must be assured the fidelity of the party to itself, and in that is the certain promise of its triump'. Such a result we can forecast with far less gratification, because of approaching partisan advan tages than because of the vindication it will afford of the high faith in which those illustrious men lived and died who, when they had founded our free institutions, established the Democratic party to protect and preserve them.
