WESTERN WINDS.

DEATH IN THE WAKE OF THE STORM Horrible Disasters in Illinois-People Killed, Houses and Other Buildings Demolished and General Devasta-

tion Inflicted. RACINE, Wis., May 19 -The cyclone which struck this city last night, demolished 150 houses and barns; about 20 persons were killed and 100 wounded,

Towards noon the sky became overcast and at 4 p. m., a sharp electric storm prevailed. The cyclone struck the earth with a roar and rumble similar to that which would be made up by one thousand railroad trains passing a bridge. Many occupants of dwellings sought refuge in cellars. The storm came with such rapidity that many were killed before reaching the cellars. The storm moved from this city and swept over Lake Michigan.

What an Investigation Showed. The investigation, began early this moining, only served to swell the list of casualties and make more sweeping the destruction occasioned by the cyclone last night. It is now estimated that fully 20 were killed and 100 injured. One hundred and fifty houses were demolished. Had the storm struck the business centre, the damage would not have been calculable. At Western Union junction seven miles west of Racine, many houses were wreck. ed and a man named Webber was killed. Reports of a Terrible Storm in Illinois. CHICAGO, May 19.—Meagre details have been received of a cyclone which struck the towns of Harvard and Paliharvard, Ill., and adjacent towns last night. It is understood that a number of persons were killed and at least twenty wounded. Many buildings were demolished. Horribie Results of the Illinois Storm.

CLINTON, Ill., May 19.—A terrible cyclone passed over this vicinity last night, doing a large amount of damage and killing several people. The wind took a southeasterly course and followed up Salt creek, in this county, the line of which many houses were totally destroyed. About six miles south of Clinton the wind tore down a house killing Peter Clinton his wife and an eight year old daughter, and fatally injuring another child. The members of a family named Bennison were seriously injured and many other families more or less injured, whose names could not be obtained. The damage is very great.

Further Casualties. STAUNTON, Ill., May 19 .- At 10 o'clock last night a tornado passed about three miles east of here, totally demolishing Livingston's fine farm residence and dangerously injuring Mr. Livingstone. Other buildings in the vicinity were destroyed and orchards injured. A construcorew of about 25 men on Springfield & Illinois Southar d all were seriously injured. Mr. Cant
