May Meeting of Our Local Scientists. The Linescan Society met on Saturday afternoon, May 26th, 1883, in the Museum room, in the Y. M. C. A. building. The president, J. P. Wickersham in the chair, and eight members in attendance. Three Indian girls from Carlisle were present as visitors. The minutes of the previous meeting were read in part and dues collected, after which the donations to the Library were examined and found to con-Nov. 19, 20, 21, of volume 23; Science for March 4, 1883; the Antiquarian and Orientalist, vol 5, No. 2; Scientific and Literary Gossip, published by S. E. The donations to museum were found to be a specimen of the pupa of a species of Palingenia, commonly called "May Fly" sent by mail from Walhalla, S. C., by Dr. Wm. B. Fahnestock. Specimen of "Animated Oats" (Avena Sterilis) 80 called from the fact that when laid on a smooth surface they move around in a

lively manner. Dr. S. S. Rathvon made a few remarks on some cocoons of the "Saddleback Moth," (Empretia Stimulea). Prof. J. S. Stahr read a very interesting paper on "Vegetable Monstrosities," illustrated by a curious growth of the Indian turnip (Arisama Triphyllums.) This was a specimen in which six perfect and distinct stems were found to be united in one, and the number of spodices were OAK HALL, a good deal more. The specimen was an interesting one and will be prepared by Mrs. Zell for the herbarium of the society. Miss Lefevre exhibited beautiful specimens of the "Tamarisk" (Tamarix Gallica) and American Larch (Larrx Americana.) Dr. Rathvon said that he had paid a bill of \$5 to the Academy of Natural Sciences of Philadelphia for their annual publication, and asked that the payment be approved by the society, which was done. Committee on preparation of a new code of by laws was on mo tion continued to next meeting. After a half hour or more indulged in scientific gossip of various character, the society adjourned to meet on Saturday, June 30 1883, at 2} p. m. in the museum.
