The prisoner was Henry Moore, an aged prisoner, who has lain in jail since the week following the township election of March last. He was arrested on the charge of having voted in Princeton township after he had already voted in West Windsor. When arraigned this morning by Prosecutor Beasley the old man pleaded guilty.

Lawyer Dennis, his counsel, asked the court to hear the prisoner's statement before sentence was pronounced. Consent being given, Moore stood up and said : "I am an old man, ignorant of the law, and I was influenced to do this thing by

Captain Vankirk. I've worked for him and knew he was a big man in the county and didn't think he'd tell me to do any thing wrong. He came to my place and advised me, saying I could vote in both places and he would give me five dollars to pay my way back and forth. I could't sie, sleeplessness and dyspepsia. H. Frasher are competing for the district at torneyship, with the fight between Hertzog and Cochran.
