Megular Correspondence From the Gap The work of reducing the railroad grade at the Gap is at last beginning to show signs of progress. This undertaking, which was begun over a year ago has, within the last few months, been progressing rapidly, and if the work continues at this rate, the great impedi ment to the travel on the road will be removed, at an earlier date than expected. aqueduct which is about twenty eight feet in depth, was a successful device, for the purpose of draining the "cut."
