Timely Notes for Husbandmen.

German-town Telegraph. A very valuable addition to the soil, particularly about fruit trees and flowers, would be the scales which drop off from iron white being worked at forger, also iron filings and trimmings.

It is said that the best treatment for hyacinth bulbs, after flowering in the house, is to plant the ball of earth containing the bulb in the garden, where some of the exhausted strength of the root will be regained before removal in the fall.

There is a new wrinkle just started about ensilage, which may be worth thinking about—that is, to allow one-half the crop of corn grown to mature, and the same as it is made for the silo with the younger corn, and mixing it all in one. This would have the advantage, that while the matured stalks would be just as good as the other, the entire crop of grain would be secured, and it would be just so much more done for the silo, the two crops would have to be planted at different dates to use in this way.

This work can scarcely be extended beyond the garden, and even there it can be performed only on not over-large trees. The pear is especially needed to have this operation performed, and it should be done at almost any time now, and the sooner perhaps the better, as the started, or imperfect surplus growth removed. Care should be taken to thin out the clusters, as the fruit seldom does well where the specimens touch each other.
