NEWS BY CABLE.

KELLY HANGED IN DUBLIN TO-DAY. A Large Crowd of People Present, But No Demonstration - A Statement of Kelly's Innocence.

DEBIL - Timothy Kelley, who was convicted of participation in the Phoenix park murder, was hanged in Kilmainham jail at eight o'clock this morning. He was the fifth man executed for those murders and was the last one convicted thereof.

Carey, the informer, cursed. A large police and military force surrounded the prison, but the crowd was broken up. When the flag was hoisted in the crowd uttered shrieks, and a young woman fell on her knees and called "the curse of God on James Carey, the informer." Kelly left no statement regarding the murder.

A Disgrace on England. ALEXANDRIA, June 9. - The execution of Suleiman Daud here this morning for setting fire to Alexandria took place in the midst of the ruins of the Great Square.

Not a Brave Arab. Suleiman had to be almost carried to the scaffold and he was nearly comatose from fright before he was hanged. Some say that he died before the drop fell.

TELEGRAPH NEWS. Afternoon Wire News Condensed. At Chester, Pa., Dennis Green, colored, who killed Joseph Clark by a blow with a blackjack in February last, was this morning found guilty of murder in the second degree.

At Trenton, N. J., the Stock stocking factory was completely destroyed by a supposed incendiary fire this morning. Loss, \$12,000; fully insured. Two hundred girls are thrown out of employment.

A heavy wind and rain storm last night did great damage to houses, barns, &c., around Springfield, Illinois. No one was injured.

The court of common pleas in Philadelphia to-day annulled the decree of divorce obtained by Major Azor H. Nickerson, of the ground that he had obtained by fraud and disseminated the libel and imposed the payment of all costs upon the libellant.

The wife of Philip Hart, the missing merchant of Trenton, N. J., who disappeared in New York a month ago, and was supposed to have been murdered, has received a letter from her husband, dated Louisville, Ky. He assigns no reason for his mysterious disappearance.

THE BARBER BROTHERS HUNG. Taken from the Jail by a Mob and Strung Up on a Tree. WAREHOUSES. The Barber brothers were taken from jail by a mob at 11:30 last night and hung to a tree half a mile from the jail. The mob was composed of men from Fayette county and was led by a brother of Deputy Sheriff Sheppard, who was killed by the Barber brothers last fall.

Returned Himself to Death. PHILADELPHIA, June 9. - Henry Fenner, aged 26, residing at 1531 Ward street, was turned to death this morning. He had been deranged for some time past, and two friends remained with him last night to watch him. When they left this morning Fenner went into the yard, poured coal oil over himself and set fire to his clothing.

A Theatre Manager Shot by a Reporter. KANSAS CITY, June 9. - George Fredericks, proprietor of the Theatre Comique, was shot and killed about midnight by John Bell, a reporter for the Evening Star, at a lodging place. The trouble was about a woman who was known as Fredrick's mistress. Bell claims that he acted in self defense.

Wants Her Name Changed. CHICAGO, June 9. - Frances M. Scoville was divorced from her husband George Scoville last January. She had a petition in the circuit court yesterday to have her name changed to Frances Maria Howe.
