NO UNUSUAL DEMAND FOR ARMS. Stories of Large Orders From Foreign Coun

Didn't find a lover ?"

New York manufacturers of arms and munitions of war are unanimous in denying any unusual activity in their trade. A story was published recently to the effect that agents of China were supposed to be giving large orders. The general manager of the Winchester company said: "If that were the case I do not think I should care to have it published but I can assure you, as a fact, that no such orders are being received in this country. There is no large foreign demand for American arms of any kind except from Russia, Turkey and South America. Moreover, the trouble be tween France and China would not lead at this time to buying of arms. Preparanot after hostilities have begun." The manager of the Winchester company spoke in the same way. "There is noth ing whatever in the story," he said. "The trade is no livelier now than it has been for the past two years. Every rifle factory has a steady volume of business which

has not, for a long time, been either in creased or diminished." "What becomes of all the guns?" "You might as well ask what becomes of all the old pins. Nearly all the rifles made in this country are sold west of the Missouri river. Pistols go all over the country, but chiefly to the West and for disabled weapons. Cer South. tain contractors are always ready to buy them, as well as old cannon and old weapons and missles of every kind. These are furbished up, cleaned and repaired, and then sent to Africa and other half civilized countries." Several contractors for military supplies also declared that their trade was as dull as it had ever been and they knew nothing of any demand for arms for China.

They Do Talk.

Conkling and President Arthur never speak when they pass by. Mr. Cookling was in Washington the other day and a special correspondent graphically describes a scene which he witnessed, to wit : "Mr. Conkling's private secretary walked a few paces behind him, carry ing a small satchel. Turning the corner of Eighth and G streets the distinguished ex-senator met the president, who was taking his morning 'constitutional' ride. Conkling stopped to let the carriage pass and politely raised his hat, saying, 'Good morning, Mr. President.' General Arthur responded by lifting his hat, smiling pleasantly. His bays so: n took him out of sight. It was a picture for an artist. No one who witnessed this greeting could believe that there was any truth in the stories of a coolness between the presi dent and Mr. Conkling."

The Postal System in Japan. The growth of the Japanese postal and

telegraph system has been marvelous. Telegraphic communication is established between each of the chief cities and all parts of the world. There are now 4,000 post offices, besides receiving agencies, street letter boxes, money order offices, and postal saving banks. Some 22,000, 000 letters and over 7,000,000 postal cards have passed through the office in one year. During the same period nearly 8,000,000 newspapers were posted, showing an increase in the native press of 15 per cent. in twelve months.
