YAQUI BRIDE CATUMING.

The Fxciting Marriage Ceremonies Witness ed in a Mexican Indian Camp. Sonora Letter.

In company with Mr. Bates, who came to this place with me from Hermosillo, I visited the settlement of the Yaqui In dians, situated on the river of the same name. Our entrance was announced by the clamorous baying of the dogs, who. keeping close to our horses' heels, followed us through the town, which differs very little from an ordinary Mexicau village.

The Indians are governed by an alcade appointed by the Maxican government, and who is usually their chief, for, although peaceful and law-abiding, the Yaqui is proud and will not permit a ruler save of their own race. Before this individual we were immediately summoned, and Mr. Bates, who is well known to the chief, announced the object of our visit. The chief, who spoke Spanish fluently, assured us of our welcome, placing apartments in his own house at our disposal. The excitement and bustle which we imagined our arrival caused, the chief informed us, was owing to the mar riage on the following day of several daughters of the tribe. Not wishing to lose a sight so interesting as this promised to be we repaired early to the place where the ceremony was to be performed, which had for music a sort of drum, accompanied by fife and reed whistles, producing a weird, though not displeasing consonance. Then follow sports and games, which last until well into the afternoon, when the real ceremony of " bride catching " be

The would-be bride is stationed by her father some hundred yards in front of her suitor; then, at a given signal, she starts for a goal distant about half a mile, to reach which and return, tefore overtaken by her pursuer, releases her from his attentions. The result, as you may imagine is not frequent, as toese dusky maidens are as eager to be "caught" as their more favored sisters of civilized countries. I have never witnessed anywhere a more exciting race than this. The maidens straight and well formed, standing in their tunic dress reaching from the swelling bosom to the knee, exposing yet conceal ing their charms, stood chatting with each other until the signal was given, when, presto! away like the wind they sped, followed by the young buck, who soon diminished the distance between them and the marriage ceremony is completed, after which their games continue until a late hour when the village again assumes a quietness and silence only broken by the baying of the dogs, which are a real pest in all Mexican towns, as well as among the Indian tribes.
