POLITICAL MATTERS.

The President's Action—The Democrats

Garry Anaspota. The president has directed the suspension of so much of the order reorganizing the internal revenue districts as changed the existing system in New Jersey.

The president has issued there three collection districts in the state and the number was reduced by the reorganization to two by consolidating the old Third and the old Fifth districts.

Collector of the old Third district, designated as collector of the consolidated district. The present action allows the state three districts and continues Robert B. Hawthorne as collector of the Fifth district.

The local election in Annapolis, Maryland, yesterday, resulted in the choice of Dr. Claude, Democrat, for mayor by 56 majority. The Democrats also elected their candidate for city councillor by 47 majority.

Of councilmen elected, three were Democrats and two Republicans, there being one tie. As a result of this first time for many years that the Democrats carried Annapolis, they indulged in a torchlight parade at night.

Colonel G. W. Hoebing yesterday resigned the position of chief engineer of the East river bridge, at New York, and was appointed consulting engineer, with annual salary. His chief assistant, Mr. Martin, was appointed engineer and superintendent of the bridge.

It is stated that the total amount of money received for the building of the bridge up to the first of this month was \$14,999,550, and the expenditures were \$14,941,538.

Secretary Lincoln left Washington on Sunday evening for New York to be absent for several days. Postmaster General Greenham left Washington yesterday for New York.

Commodore Thomas S. Phelps has informed the navy department that he assumed command of the South Atlantic squadron on the 31st instant, and appointed his staff.

The president yesterday appointed Chas. K. Coutant postmaster at Omaha in place of Thomas F. Hall, suspended for inefficiency.

ENOUGH OF THIS WORLD.

A Mother Slings Herself, a Steward Takes Poison and a Butcher Lances Himself. Mrs. D. Mazzoni, a German who lives at 818 Vine street, Philadelphia, where her Italian husband keeps a fruit store, attempted to commit suicide Monday morning by hanging herself with a strip of sheeting to a nail in the wall.

Her husband arose about six o'clock, leaving her in bed, and went down stairs to open the store. About an hour later he called to her to get up and two women, who live in the same house, went to her room to tell her that her husband wanted her. She was not discovered in her bed room, where her two children were sleeping, but going to an adjoining apartment they found her hanging. Her feet were resting upon the floor and the body was limp and bent. She was immediately cut down. She was insensible. A physician was sent for. When he arrived he restored her to consciousness and last night it was believed she would recover.

Mrs. Mazzoni is 30 years of age. About a month ago one of her children died and her grief is said to have rendered her demented and desperate at times. It is to this condition of mind that the attempt on her life is ascribed.

Thomas Davis, an English steward on the steamship Lord Gough, whose home is in Liverpool, attempted suicide on Sunday night on board the steamer. He was taken to the Pennsylvania hospital, where he told the physicians he had been poisoned with arsenic by some one on board the ship. Upon investigation, however, this statement could not be verified. A bottle of laudanum was found in his room. He is in a dangerous condition.

Frederick Hasa, a laborer, living at 2008 Mascher street, Philadelphia, killed himself Monday by cutting an artery in an arm. He had been dependent for several days.
