SEA FOAM.

GUSSIP OF THE WATERING PLAUKS.

Suggestions as to Bathing Costume—Styles of the Season-A Palace at Newport -Its Fine Apartments.

This is what a correspondent of the Pittsburgh Post saw at Long Branch : A hundred or more men and women clad as for the ring, were postured on the beach, as truly for exhibition as though they had not been nonchalantly chatting, and as many more were frolicking in the water, turning summersaults into the incoming breakers, swimming and floating, playing tricks on one another and it various ways making the most remarkable entertainmnet ever given without money and without price. But in this, as in most sports, the best efforts of amateurs are eclipsed by professional achievements. Two actresses made their appearance in garb that the most daring of other women could not even contemplate without expressing scorn-or was some of it in envy. Mary Prescott came first, wearing two pairs of stockings-one the exact color of her bared arms, and over these some red socks, so that the impression given at a glance was that her limbs were bare. Then she in turn was outdone by Etelka Berry, in no skirts at all, but encased skin-tight in a bodice, trunks and hose of knitted stuff. She lay for an hour flat on the sand, and long before the end of that time was the focus of hundreds of staring eyes. Although admiration might have been detected in some of this gazing, the comments were wholly unfavorable. The women were especially severe in their remarks, and so loud that Berry could not have failed to hear some of the condemnation.

I turned to see the speaker, and was astounded, for she was a girl attired quite as sparingly, except that a skirt barely covered her hips. She was the centre of a group of fellows, palpably the object of their curious visual attention, and not in the least disturbed by her position or condition. And she was the highly respectable and accomplished daughter of a Philadelphia "first family." Thus you will understand that, however improper Berry may have been, this critic was not to be censured. A PALATIAL RESIDENCE.

Mr. Robert Goelet's New House at Newport Placed on a charming site, with an ex tensive lawn reaching down to the ocean, the beauty of the house and its surroundings attract immediate attention. Everything about the property is done on a grand scale. To reach the house one has to pass through a broad carriage-way which skirts the lawn on the northern side and comes past the house to the other end of the estate. By this way the full beauty of the surroundings can be appreciated. Queen Anne, though modifications to give freedom and picturesqueness to the whole

have been made throughout. High above the broad entranca, between the two massive towers which project from the front of the edifice, have been placed large bronze scrolls, set in huge rectangles of mosaic work, for the inscription of the name and date of erection of the build iug. These devices in front and rear form the only variation from the uniform unfinished brick of the lower and the stained shingles of the second story.

Through a massive oak door, plenti-fully studded with brass nails in fanciful patterns, admssion is gained from the long piazza between the towers to the still longer hall, which also extends through to the rear of the edifice and is two stories in height. In all its design and joiner work it shows admirable skill and finish in detail and evokes enthusiastic praise

from all beholders. The richly tinted oak panelling extends to the ceiling, where it meets carved corni ces and roughly hewn oak beams which support the ceiling, and gains additional richness of color from the stained glass windows in the front and near of both

Above the immense fireplace, which claims attention in the centre of the right wall, are placed six elegantly carved panels which reach to the ceiling. These were expressly imported for the purpose. A balcony runs across the front and half of the two sides on a level with the second floor, the colonnade and railing support ing it being skilfully carved and turned. A recess between the fireplace and the front of the building formed by the tower contains the broad staircase winding to the balcony landing above.

Through a large window can be seen the lawn and the sea in the rear. Folding doors admit the visitor to the dining hall, which also has large windows overlooking the Atlantic. The apartment is furnished from floor to ceiling with mahogany and cherry panels beautifully carved. This room, in common with all the other principal apartments, contains an elegant fire place with carved mantel and plate glass mirror. A magnificent sideboard of mahogany occupies nearly the entire east side The casements and doors are of mahogany and the floor is of ash. In succession, to the east of the dining

hall, are the butler's room, patry, kitcher and laundry.

Across a narrowoak furnished hall is the music room, finished in redwood with high wainscoting and frescoed panels, and numerous shelves above the fireplace and to one side of the same. Three large windows permit a broad view of the front lawn and the cliffs to the eastward. On the left a door opens into a billiard room, the cherry wainscot of which is as high as the doors, leaving a large border for frescoes. The windows command a view of the lawn also.

Diagonally across the large hall, the uniform oak hue of which contrasts ad mirably with the wood colors in the adjoining apartments, an eutrance is obtained through folding doors into the drawing room. The woodwork of the apartment is ivory white, and the walls are covered with an embossed papier mache

Large windows command a view of both front and rear lawns. Access is had to the large veranda, which begins here and runs around the west and south sides as far as the butler's room. Broad steps connect the veranda with the terrace and the ter-

race with the lawn. Over the library is a room with tinted walls and ivory-white wood, with a bay window in the southeast corner and a large window overlooking the carriage way to the gates. A bath room and cedar clothes. press are connected with this and another with the bedroom adjoining, over the drawing room, The joiner work and finish in these and the apartments for guests are of the finest; these two rooms are furnished with electric bell-calls. The other bedrooms are finished in pine, either painted or varnished, the floors being of hard pine. In the eastern wing are also

three bath rooms, with mamorous rooms for servants, who have also accommodation above the principal chatchers.
