Matters of Government.

The following banks have been authorized by the acting comptroller of the currency to begin business: The Chesapeake national bank of Norfolk, New York, capital, \$100,000; the Albion, national bank of Albion, Iowa, capital \$50,000; Indiana national bank, of Bedford, Indiana, capital \$50,000, and the first national bank of Mexico, Texas, capital, \$50,000.

The internal revenue receipts from the twelve districts of New York state for the fiscal year which ended on the 30th of June, show a falling off of nearly \$1,500,000 from the receipts for the preceding fiscal year.

The total export from Canada during June amounted in value to \$10,173,596, and the total imports to \$9,090,651.

The collection of inland revenue during the month amounted to \$504,238, and the customs receipts to \$1,600,440.

The patent office yesterday issued 371 patents, 24 designs, 19 trade marks, 10 labels and one reissue of a patent. Thirty five patents and designs and two trade marks and labels were issued to foreigners.

It is thought the bond call to be issued by Secretary Folger before the close of this month will be for twenty five million.

It has been decided in Santa Fe to continue the celebration of the "tercio millennial" of New Mexico until August 15th. The historic pageant of the week will be repeated on the 9th and 10th proximo.

Water Troubles.

A water famine is threatened in St. Louis. Only 24 feet of water remain in the reservoir by which a large portion of the city is supplied for drinking purposes, and the pumping capacity of the works is not equal to the requirements of the present warm weather.

In consequence of a communication from the board of public improvements the mayor yesterday issued a proclamation stopping all street sprinkling, the washing of sidewalks and the use of hand hose.

Washouts occurred on Monday along the Chicago and Northwestern line in Wisconsin, and on the Milwaukee, Lake Shore and Western tracks near Appleton, and on the Wisconsin Central road at Theresa. The telegraph lines everywhere are in bad condition.

The Milwaukee river has risen more than four feet above the danger line, wholesale stores are flooded in many places, and lumber is floating from the yards near the mouth of the river. At Grand Rapids, Wisconsin, the storm caused the destruction of several buildings.

A tornado demoralized the house of Eugene Henry, near Eaton Rapids, Mich., on Monday. Mr. Henry was seriously injured, and will probably die. Three of his children were killed, and his wife sustained severe injuries, but may recover.

Miss Annie Day, a young woman, was drowned at one of the waves at Wilmington, Delaware, on Sunday night, by the upsetting of a boat. Her body has been recovered.

Obituary Report.

Thomas Swann, ex-governor of Maryland, died last evening at his home near Leesburg, Virginia, aged 78 years. He was a representative from Baltimore in the Forty-second, Forty-third, Forty-fourth and Forty-fifth Congresses, being during his last term chairman of the committee on foreign affairs. He was at one time president of the Baltimore & Ohio railroad company.
